Regulated Person


Definition:

A person who,

- ... in the course of operating an industry, trade or business
- ... has possession, charge or control
- ... of a prescribed substance in prescribed quantities



Regulated Person





Prescribed substances

- Liquid
- Toxic
- Persistent






Types of Regulated Persons

- Rail/ Trucking
- Liquid pipelines

Fixed facilities
 (exemption for gas stations with below ground storage)








Prescribed Quantities

10,000+ litres by rail or truck

- Any quantity by 1,000+ meter pipeline
- <u>50,000</u>+ litres at a fixed facility (gas stations with below ground storage exempted)









Where A, B and C are prescribed substances





Where A is a prescribed substance





Where A is a prescribed substance and D is not



 Anyone who spills becomes a responsible person, whether they are a regulated person or not.



Regulated Persons requirements

Develop, test and implement a spill contingency plan


