AND TO RECOFFEED THAT pursuant to the Placer-Hining Act and Mineral Act and all other powers thereinto enabling no person may on and after twolve o'clock neon on Monday, the 15th day of May, 1961, enter, locate, prospect or mine upon the following areas in the Atlin and Skeens Mining Divisions, or for any mineral therein:

All those lands in the Cassiar Land-District, more particularly described as follows:

- 1. An area 1,000 feet wide, being 500 feet on each side of the centre line of Atlin River, westerly from the highwater-work of Atlin Lake for a distance of 1,000 feet along the said centre line of Atlin Miver to a line drawn true north and south.
- 2. An area 1,000 feet wide being 500 feet on each side of a strai ht line drawn south thirty degrees east from the most southerly end of Sloke Inlet, Atlin Lake, to the highwater-mark of Sloke Lake.
 - 5. An area 500 feet wide from highwater-mark surrounding Sloke Lake.
- 4. An area 1,000 feet wide, being 500 feet on each side of the centre line of Sloke liver easterly from highwater-mark of Sloke Lake for a distance of two miles along the said centre line of Sloke liver to a line drawn true north and south.
- .5. An area 1,000 feet wide, being 500 feet on each side of the centre line of Makonake liver westerly from its junction with Sloke River for a distance of twelve miles along the said centre line of Makonake River to a line drawn true east and west.
- 6. An area 500 feet wide along the north side of Taku River for a distance of four miles conthwesterly from the conthwesterly (right) bank of Sloke River.

An area with boundaries commencing at the intersection of the northerly (right) bank of Sittakanay River with the International Boundary between Eritish Columbia and Alaska; thence northwesterly along said International Boundary to the southerly (left) bank of Taku River; thence northeasterly along said southerly (left) bank for a distance of two and one-half (2) miles; thence south forth-five degrees east for a distance of one half (%) a mile; thence south thirty degrees west for a distance of one and one-half (1%) miles; thence due south to the aforesaid northerly (right) bank of the Sittakanay River; thence westerly along said northerly (right) bank to the point of commencement. 8. Commencing at the intersection of the westerly extension of the north boundary of Lot 4557 with the shore of Atlin Lake, thence east 400 feet, thence north 1500 feet, thence west to a point 250 feet west of the shore of Atlin Lake, thence southeasterly to a point on the westerly extension of the north boundary of Lot 4357, 250 feet west of the point of commencement. 9. Commencing at the south corner of Lot 252, thence northeasterly along the southeasterly boundary of said Lot 252 to a point where the northwesterly extension of the southwesterly boundary of Lot 278 intersects the said southeasterly boundary of Lot 252, thence southeasterly along the said southwesterly boundary and its extensions of Lot 278 to where said extension intersects the westerly side of Tatlow Street, thence southerly along the west side of Tatlow Street to the northerly side of Fulton Street, thence westerly along the northerly side of Fulton Street and the extension thereof to a point on the southeasterly extension of the southwesterly boundary of Lot 252, thence northwesterly along the said extension of the southwesterly boundary of Lot 252 to the point of commencement. Commencing at a point 4,300 feet northerly from the northwesterly corner of Lot 253 along the extension of the westerly boundary of said lot. the said point of commoncement being on the easterly shore of Atlin Lake, thence east 400 feet, thence north 1,500 feet, thence west 750 feet, thence south 1,500 feet, thence east 350 feet to the point of commencement. 11. Commencing at the northwest corner of Lot 60, thence east to the intersection of the northerly extension of the east boundary of STL 9533P with the south boundary of STL 12129P, thence south to the northeast corner of STL 9533P, thence west to the southeast corner of Lot 62, thence south one mile, thence west half a mile, thence south along the east boundary of

Commencing at the southeast corner of STL 9525P, thence west along the south boundary of said lot, thence north alon; the west boundary of said lot, thence east along the north boundary of said lot to the southeast corner of STL 9532", thence north along the east boundary of said lot, thence east along the north boundary of STL 9527? and Lot 898 and the easterly extension thereof to the shore of Hastings Arm, thence southwesterly to the point of commencement.

15. Commencing at the westerly corner of Lot 1407, thence east 2,700 feet, thence southwesterly to a point 1,350 feet east of the southeast corner of Lot 4600, thence west 3,750 feet, thence northerly to a point 900 feet west of the westerly corner of Lot 1407, thence east to the point of commencement.

16. Cormencing at the southeast corner of Lot 4435, thence east 1,200 feet, thence north 3,700 feet, thence west 2,700 feet, thence southerly 3,700 feet more or less, parallel to the international boundary, to a point on the westerly extension of the south boundary of Lot 4435, thence east along the said southerly boundary and extension of Lot 4435 to the point of commencement.

17. All those lands in the Nass River Valley and tributaries thereof lying below the one thousand foot contour of elevation upstream from where the said contour intersects the fifty-five degree fifteen minute parallel of north latitude.

16. All lands in the valley of the Bell-Irving River and its tributaries lying below the 1500-foot contour of elevation upstream from the point at which the 1000-foot contour of elevation intersects the said Bell-Irving River; and

All lands in the valley of the Bell-Irving Miver and its tributaries lying below the 2000-foot contour of elevation upstream from where 56 degrees and 27 minutes of north latitude crosses the valley of the said Bell-Irving River.

except in accordance with and subject to the following terms and conditions:

- (1) That any free miner who locates a placer claim or mineral claim and obtains a record thereof or who obtains a placer lease or a mineral lease shall do so at his own risk and shall not interfere or allow any person exploring, developing, mining, or working in any way the said claim or leasehold to obstruct or to interfere in any manner with the exercise of any right, whether existing or subsequently granted, of any other person to flood, or to occupy for any purpose connected with the development of hydro-electric pover, the areas reserved, or to construct, operate and maintain any work done or structure erected for any of the foregoing purposes and the free miner shall not be entitled to compensation for any damage which may be done to his mining operation, plant or equipment by the aforesaid exercise of any right whether existing or subsequently granted.
- (2) To free miner shell carry on any mining operation within fifteen hundred feet of any dam, conduit, water tunnel, spillway or power plant, or within five hundred feet of any transmission line or any other work or structure which may be crected in the areas reserved except with the permission of the Chief Inspector of Mines:
- (3) A person including the Grown or its agent, who builds or proposes to build a dam, conduit, water tunnel, or power plant, or transmission line, or any ways, works, or atructures in the areas reserved shall not interfere with or dislocate or obstruct any existing mining operation, plant, or equipment without:
 - (a) Inserting an advertisement of such intention in one issue of the British Columbia Gazetta and in one issue of a newspaper circulating in the district in which the reserved areas are situated, not less than thirty days nor more than ninety days before the actual start of the work or operation which will result in such interference, dislocation or obstruction takes place: and

- (b) Giving at least ninety days notice in writing to the owner or holder of a mineral claim, lease or placer-mining claim, as the case may be, or his representative, which notice shall be deemed to have been sufficiently given if it is mailed to the address noted upon the last tax notice issued in respect of a Crown-granted mineral claim or noted in the most recent relevant record of the Gold Commissioner, and any notice so given shall be deemed to have been received when, in the ordinary course of mail, it should have been delivered. No notice under this torm or condition need be delivered to a free miner or lessee, or his representative, who records a placer claim or a mineral claim or applies for a mineral lease or files a notice of intention to apply for a placer-mining lease after the insertion of the advertisements required by paragraph (3) (a) above:
- (4) The benefit of the conditions set forth in this order inures to the Grown and its agents, to persons contracting with the Grown with respect to the development of the areas reserved and to licencees under the ""ater Act":
- (5) The free miner shall before making application to record a placer claim or a mineral claim or before making application for a mineral lease or filing a notice of intention to apply for a placer lease, execute and deliver to the Gold Commissioner a release, in quadruplicate, in favour of Her Majesty in the right of Ner Province of British Columbia, and licences, assigness, agents and servants, from any cause of action, claim, demand or action, which he may at any time have or allege as the result of any exploration, development, mining or working of any area which may be included in a placer claim, a mineral claim, a placer lease or a mineral lease or as the result of occupation of any land for any purpose connected with the development of hydro-electric power or as the result of any structure, operation, or maintenance of any work done or structure creeted for any of the purposes act forth in paragraph (1).
