To His Honour

*The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:*

The undersigned has the honour to recommend pursuant to Section 14 (5) of the "Mineral Act" and Section 16 (1) of the "Placer-mining Act", chapters 213 and 214 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1948, respectively, a reservation be placed upon all minerals in the following areas in the Lillooet Mining Division, namely:

An area 1000 feet wide, being 500 feet on each side of a line drawn south 16 degrees 44 minutes east for a distance of 12,000 feet from a point on the south boundary of Lot 3023, 3800 feet westerly from the intersection of the said boundary and the westerly boundary of Lot 5422 to a point on the westerly extension of the south boundary of Lot 3041, 500 feet from the southwest corner of the said lot; and

An area 2200 feet by approximately 800 feet commencing at the intersection of the aforesaid line with the westerly extension of the south boundary of said Lot 3041, thence west 300 feet, thence south 800 feet more or less to the north boundary of Lot 3055, thence 2200 feet east along the said north boundary to the northeast corner of Lot 3055, thence north to the south boundary of Lot 3041, thence west 1900 feet along the said south boundary and its extension to the point of commencement:

And further to recommend that pursuant to subsection (6) of Section 14 of the "Mineral Act" as enacted by chapter 213 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1948 and amended by chapter 49, 1955, and subsection (2) of Section 16 of the "Placer-mining Act" as enacted by chapter 214 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1948 and amended by chapter 50, 1955, the mineral reserves herein established be cancelled midnight November 15th, 1956, subject to the following regulations and that the Minister sign a notice to this effect and publish it in the Gazette:

No person who may hereafter acquire mineral rights under the "Mineral Act" or the "Placer-mining Act" within the area formerly reserved shall be entitled to compensation for damage to his operations caused by flooding of all or any part of the area, or by any work done or structure erected to develop and transport hydroelectric energy; and

No person shall prospect or mine within 1500 feet of any dam, spillway or power plant, or within 500 feet of any transmission line or any other works or structures erected or that may be erected within the area formerly reserved for the purpose of developing and transporting hydroelectric energy, unless the approval of the Chief Inspector of Mines has first been obtained.
