

Metric tonnes CO2 equivalent (tCO2e)





#### Offsets Applied to Become Carbon Neutral in 2010

School District 19 has applied total emissions offsets to become carbon neutral for 2010. Some emissions are currently exempt from carbon offsets. As required by section 5 of the Carbon Neutral Government Regulation, 96.36 tonnes CO2e of emissions resulting from the operation of school buses were reported as part of our greenhouse gas emissions profile in 2010. However, they were not offset as they are out- of-scope under section 4(2)(c) of the Carbon Neutral Government Regulation

#### **Emissions Reductions Activities – Summary**

School District 19 (Revelstoke) is currently reviewing energy consumption at all district facilities to re-establish targets for energy consumption reduction. In 2010 our school district completed a comprehensive energy efficient lighting upgrade at 3 of our facilities. We have engaged BC Hydro in discussions regarding our PowerSmart Partnership for our 2 new schools that are currently under construction. When completed in September 2012, our new elementary school will result in the closure of 2 old, energy inefficient, elementary schools. Our new secondary school, which will open in September 2011 will result in the immediate closure and demolition of our existing secondary school. Both of our new schools will be built to a very high standard of energy efficiency and sustainability and both will be eligible LEED Gold certification.

We have changed our approach to cleaning our schools. Custodians now operate in teams so that schools can be cleaned quickly and can then be shut down for the evening to reduce energy consumption. We have also re-organized the community user groups that use District facilities in order to concentrate these activities at a few sites which in turn enables us to shut down other sites in the evening.

The school district embarked on a district-wide commitment to reduce energy consumption by 8% in 2010. We have met and/or exceeded that commitment in all of the facilities used for instructional purposes.

In 2010 three of our schools were retrofitted with energy efficient lighting throughout the facilities. Two of our elementary schools will be the subject of an energy audit in the coming year which will help us identify areas where further projects could be undertaken to reduce energy consumption and greenhouse gas emissions.
