CORONER'S INQUEST INTO THE DEATH OF COLIN TREMEER SCHEDULED

KELOWNA – The coroner's inquest into the death of Colin Kenson Tremeer has been scheduled. Following his arrest on Aug. 5, 2007, Mr. Tremeer went into medical distress upon arrival at the Kelowna RCMP detachment. Emergency medical services responded and he was transferred to Kelowna General Hospital where, despite medical treatment, he died.

The inquest is scheduled for Dec. 18-19, 2007. Presiding coroner Tonia Grace and a fiveperson jury will publicly hear evidence from subpoenaed witnesses in order to determine the facts surrounding the death. The jury will have the opportunity to make recommendations aimed at preventing deaths under similar circumstances in the future.
