Briefly describe the top three actions taken by your organization in 2018 to reduce GHG emissions and/or improve sustainability from its operations:

Action

- 1. NVIT continues to utilize improved video conference and on-line technology for campus-to-campus meetings. Avoiding unnecessary travel has resulted in a small decrease in fleet fuel consumption.
- 2. The planning, design, and construction of a new building on the Merritt campus includes both geothermal and solar energy. The envelope and orientation of the building was also designed to be energy efficient.

Briefly describe plans your organization has for continuing to reduce your GHG emissions in future years:

- Continue to use video conference / telephone conference instead of travel where possible
- Continue to purchase 100% recycled paper
- Continue to purchase "Powersmart" equipment and appliances
- Continue to maintain vehicles on a regular basis to ensure continued fuel efficiency
- As light fixtures require replacement we will convert to more energy efficient fixtures
 We are seeking capital funding for repairs/replacement of portions of the HVAC system at the Merritt campus
