

Importing Queens & Packaged Bees

Canadian beekeepers can import queens and packaged bees from several approved sources. All bee imports into Canada require an <u>Import Permit</u> issued by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA). Please be aware that the status of approved honey bee sources may change due to their disease/pest profile.

Approved sources include:

Queens: New Zealand, Australia, California and Hawaii **Packages**: New Zealand, Australia

Import Permits involve a few, regardless of the size of the order. For smaller shipments, ordering through a Canadian supplier or group purchase is cheaper and more convenient.

When ordering bees from sources overseas plan for the earliest date of delivery. Early season shipments are often better quality and queens adjust better.
