- INSTRUCTIONS & TEMPLATE FOR SMALL EMITTERS -

This document provides guidance for provincial public sector organizations (PSOs) whose GHG emissions were less than 600 tonnes CO₂e during the previous reporting year (2019) to help them prepare their 2020 Carbon Neutral Action Report (CNAR) in accordance with BC's *Climate Change Accountability*Act and the Carbon Neutral Government Regulation.

PSOs that emitted less than 600 tonnes CO₂e during the 2019 reporting year will receive a confirmation email from Carbon.Neutral@gov.bc.ca. The CCAR Survey is optional for Small Emitter PSOs.

C. Briefly describe the top three actions taken by your organization in 2020 to reduce GHG emissions and/or improve sustainability from its operations:

Action

- 1. Reducing use of Paper:
 - a. The default option for printing is set at black and white as compared to coloured printing
 - b. Consumed less paper by encouraging double sided printing in office and making it the default option
 - c. Documents are emailed whenever possible to avoid mailing them.
 - d. Paperless payment options like electronic fund transfer is encouraged over cheques
 - e. Electronic filing and archiving of documents as opposed to traditional paper filing.

2. Digital meetings:

- a. Employees are encouraged to use technology in document collaborations. An increased focus in digital meetings and digital sharing of information led to further reduced paper consumption
- b. Meetings uses Audio Visual equipment like projectors to present documents instead of distributing paper copies

3. Travel:

- a. Approval from senior management is required for each travel and justification is required for
 - a. Purpose of travel
 - b. Risk if travel is not approved
 - c. Not conducting meetings through Video Conferencing etc.
- b. Travel is minimized by employing Video-conferencing equipment in meetings with internal and external stakeholders
- c. When travel cannot be avoided, staff are encouraged to book multiple meetings (within same travel period) to increase efficiency
- d. The organization participated in bike to work week to encourage environmentally friendly transit.

D. Briefly describe plans your organization has for continuing to reduce your GHG emissions in future years:

Our organization continues to abide by the actions as mentioned in question c above. We will encourage employees to further enhance the usage of digital meetings and document collaborations as opposed to meeting in person (and reducing travel) and printing papers.
