RE: Certification of No Intentional Subliminal Advertising or Messaging Contained in Electronic Games

Effective immediately, all electronic games submitted for independent testing for use in British Columbia must include in the submission letter, a statement certifying that there is no intentional subliminal advertising and/or messaging contained in the game or related game and paytable software. Failure to provide this information may result in a refusal of certification for the gaming equipment pursuant to Section 75 of the *Gaming Control Act*.

Additionally, please confirm in writing to this office on or before March 31, 2007 that all electronic games, including related game and paytable software, currently supplied by your company for use in British Columbia do not contain any intentional subliminal advertising or messaging.
