

Road Use Permits Mandatory for FSR Users

All BCTS TSL holders who use a Forest Service Road (FSR) for accessing their TSL for timber harvesting operations, must apply for and hold a valid Road Use Permit (RUP) prior to beginning timber harvesting or road construction on their TSL.

Holding a valid RUP is a requirement of section 22.1 of the Forest and Range Practices Act (FRPA). Failure to comply with this requirement may have the following consequences:

- An administrative penalty under section 71 of FRPA,
- Suspension of TSL(s), cancellation of TSL(s), disqualification from registration for failure to comply with the licence agreement and the forestry legislation,
- Forfeiture of all or a portion of the TSL deposit for failure to comply with the licence agreement and the forestry legislation,
- An increase in the amount of future TSL deposits.
