January 12- March 23 Young Agrarians Business Bootcamp

January 16 - Applications open for the BC Climate Agri-Solutions Fund (BCCAF)!

The application window will be open January 16 to February 16. BCCAF supports farmers in adopting beneficial management practices (BMPs) that store carbon and reduce greenhouse gases

in the areas of nitrogen management, cover cropping, and rotational grazing. Visit the website for more details and for applications.

January 21 - Second Generation Anticoagulant Rodenticide ban comes into effect.

Similar to the temporary ban started in July 2021, the new regulation will continue to exclude farms from the ban as essential services, however there are some requirements. Find out more about how this affects farmers in this guide.

Forage Trials Field Day event report

33 producers enjoyed having a chance to meet each other or reconnect at a field day and presentation held at Porter's Dairy Farm in Chemainus on November 30th. The field day was to report on results from a two-year Climate Change Adaptation Program demonstration project of alternative (non-corn) annual silage crops conducted on several Vancouver Island farms.

The purpose of the research is to learn how different cereal, grass, and legume mixes perform on Vancouver Island and how to incorporate these into farm operations. This knowledge could help cattle and dairy producers find annual silage blends to grow in marginal low-lying fields or in soils that are too wet for perennial forage crops, and enable them to cultivate this under-used land. Producers also learned about the growth habits and nutritional values of alternative silage varieties and may inform transitioning from or rotating with these crops that may have less water and fertilizer demands than corn.

The crops trialed were whole crops of barley, field peas, red clover and Oats, forage peas, and Italian ryegrass. Further research and workshops on growing, feeding, and improving the nutrition of these types of annual forage blends could be useful, as many of this cohort of producers either are interested and already trying alternatives or could use more information (and others trying it first). Further discussion of this topic is planned for the Islands Agriculture Show in February.

The field day was presented by Graeme Fowler who has been coordinating the project, and attended by Bejay Mills, the Regional Agrologist for Mid-Island. BC Dairy Association helped fund the project and Industry Partners included Pacific Forage and Top Shelf Feeds.

Funding for The Climate Change Adaptation Program has been provided by the Governments of Canada and British Columbia through the Canadian Agricultural Partnership, a federal-provincial-territorial initiative. The program is delivered by the Investment Agriculture Foundation of BC.
