Part 2 - Objectives

- Objectives for Old Growth Management Areas
- (1) Maintain or recruit old growth forests in established Old Growth subject to subsections (2) to (6) below. Management Areas, as shown on the map attached as Schedules 1 and 2

- (2) Despite subsection 1, timber harvesting and road or bridge construction are permitted within OGMAs, provided that:
- the area of the OGMA that is subject to timber harvesting or road or of the area of the OGMA, bridge construction does not exceed the greater of one hectare or 10%
- replacement forest is identified which is
- biologically suitable
- of equivalent age, structure and area, and,
- the OGMA, or adjacent to another OGMA in the same situated in order of priority, either immediately adjacent to variant and landscape unit as the existing OGMA, and
- road or bridge construction, if applicable, is required to access practicable option for road or bridge location exists resource values beyond or adjacent to the OGMA and no other
- 3 For the purposes of subsection (2)(b) and (c), as an alternative to permanently deactivated and rehabilitated within four years after identifying replacement area, a temporary road or bridge site may be
- (4) Within OGMAs, the following activities are permitted:
- First Nations traditional use of trees or understory plants
- Topping or pruning of trees along boundaries to improve wind
- C diseases that pose significant threat to forested areas outside of as many old growth forest attributes as possible. Timber harvesting to prevent the spread of insect infestations or OGMAs. Salvage within OGMAs will be done in a manner that retains
- 9 Road maintenance, deactivation, removal of danger trees, or brushing way for safety purposes. and clearing on existing roads under active tenure within the right-of-
- O along cutblock boundaries or within the right-of-way on new Felling for guyline clearance, tailhold anchor trees, or danger trees road/bridge alignments to meet safety requirements.

- (5) Replacement forest is required if the total area of an OGMA that is subject biologically suitable, of equivalent age, structure and area, and situated, in order of priority, either immediately adjacent to the OGMA, or adjacent to another OGMA in the same variant and landscape unit as the OGMA hectare or 10% of the area of the OGMA. Replacement forest must be to the activities pursuant to subsection (4) exceeds the greater of one

(6) OGMA adjustments and replacements made in accordance with subsections (2) to (5) must be documented and submitted as digital spatial data to the delegated decision maker at the end of each calendar year.

- (1) This order and the land use objectives in this order take effect on the date that notice of this order is published in the Gazette.
- (2) The period of time under section 8 of the Forest and Range Practices Act is two years
