Re: Expanded Delivery Options for Cannabis Retail Store (CRS) Licensees

Current Regulation Provisions

Delivery of non-medical cannabis, cannabis accessories, permitted cannabis-related items, gift cards and shopping bags to customers can only be completed by CRS licensees and their employees.

Delivery services operated by third parties are not authorized.

The mode of transport for non-medical cannabis deliveries must be owned or leased by the CRS licensee.

New Regulation Provisions

Delivery of non-medical cannabis, cannabis accessories, permitted cannabis-related items, gift cards and shopping bags may be completed by:

- CRS licensees
- The licensee's employees
- Delivery service providers
- Common carriers

CRS licensees must ensure that delivery service providers and common carriers completing non-medical cannabis deliveries on their behalf comply with all relevant requirements.

CRS licensees are no longer required to own or lease the mode of transport used for non-medical cannabis deliveries.
