Definitions

1. In this regulation:

"Act" means the Health Professions Act;

"occupational performance" means the ability to choose, organize and effectively and safely perform everyday activities necessary for self-care and participation in educational, leisure, home management and work activities. "occupational therapy" means the health profession in which a person provides the following services with respect to the performance, by an individual, of everyday activities of self-care, productivity and leisure:

- (a) assessing the extent to which the individual can perform those activities safely and effectively;
- (b) for the purposes of maintaining, rehabilitating or improving the safe and effective performance of those activities,
 - (i) treating the individual's disease, disorder or condition using cognitive and physical methods, and
 - (ii) modifying the individual's personal and environmental conditions;
- (c) providing information and counselling with respect to the safe and effective performance of those activities;

"registrant" means a registrant who is authorized under the bylaws to practise occupational therapy.

College name

1. The name "College of Occupational Therapists of British Columbia" is the name of the college established under section 15 (1) of the Act for occupational therapy.

Reserved title

2. The title "occupational therapist" is reserved for exclusive use by registrants.

Scope of practice

- 3. A registrant may assess occupational performance and modify human and environmental conditions to maintain, restore or enhance occupational performance and health.
 - 4. A registrant may practice occupational therapy.

Patient relations program

4. The college is designated for the purposes of section 16 (2) (f) of the Act.
