Pursuant to Section 38 of the Coroners Act, the following recommendations are forwarded to the Chief Coroner of the Province of British Columbia for distribution to the appropriate agency:

JURY RECOMMENDATIONS:

To: Minister of Health and RCMP "E" Division

1. Recommendation: Improve access to mental health services so that when a Crisis Negotiation Team is deployed a mental health professional, with advanced qualifications and access to medical records/history, be activated to support the Crisis Negotiation Team in decision making.

To: RCMP "E" Division and BC Emergency Health Services

2. Recommendation: Enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to promote better communication that permits and encourages agencies to coordinate available mental health resources and expertise during a mental health crisis call.
