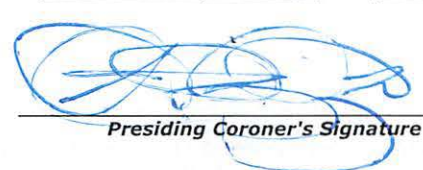

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Pursuant to Section 38 of the Coroners Act, the following recommendations are forwarded to the Chief Coroner of the Province of British Columbia for distribution to the appropriate agency:

JURY RECOMMENDATIONS:

To: Director of Policing and Law Enforcement Services, Ministry of Public Safety & Solicitor General

1. Review the Provincial Policing Standards to ensure adequate training for missing persons investigations, including consideration of the following:
 - a. the use of mentoring and technology;
 - b. designation of high-risk missing persons, including criteria such as indications of sexual assault;
 - c. training requirements are tracked, including the use of key performance indicators, visual graphs, and analytical tracking;
 - d. training is easily accessible to officers;
 - e. officers are required to regularly update their training; and
 - f. training includes Indigenous culture and is provided by elders in the context of historical challenges faced by Indigenous people, including: addictions, sexual exploitation, mental health, and residential school trauma.



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2. Review the Provincial Policing Standards to include Indigenous liaison officers in missing persons investigative units to build relationships between Indigenous communities and police agencies.
3. Review the Provincial Policing Standards to ensure recommendations on amendments to the Standards received from related disciplinary proceedings are effectively communicated throughout the office of the Director of Policing and Law Enforcement Services.
4. Review the Provincial Policing Standards to ensure police agencies are accountable for compliance with the Standards, including response timelines to determinations of non-compliance.
5. Review the Provincial Policing Standards to consider requiring police agencies to verify investigative findings from other agencies and seek those agencies' approval before communicating such findings to the public.
6. Ensure missing persons risk assessment templates used by all police agencies meet the Provincial Policing Standards and clearly define high risk.

To: Vancouver Police Department and RCMP "E" Division

7. Consider developing community networks and self-identification programs to help locate missing persons, including the use of incentives to encourage participation by vulnerable individuals.

To: Minister of Social Development & Poverty Reduction and Registrar General of Vital Statistics

8. Amend the Registration of Death with document control number 19979844 to reflect the aboriginal status of Tatyanna Harrison and to identify Natasha Harrison as her mother.
