Family Day grants available for local governments

VICTORIA – Communities throughout British Columbia will celebrate the fifth BC Family Day on Monday, Feb. 13, 2017.

The Province is again providing \$250,000 to support free local, family-focused activities with funds administered through the BC Recreation and Parks Association (BCRPA).

One-time grants up to \$1,000 are available for free community-based family events held during the BC Family Day weekend (Feb. 10-13, 2017). Funding is limited to municipal parks and recreation departments and First Nations band councils. Grants will cover entrance fees, facility costs, equipment, staffing and/or refreshments and will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.
