**ORDER**

WHEREAS:

- On December 7, 2015 Wingtat Game Bird Packers (Wingtat) filed an appeal from the November 18, 2015 decision of the British Columbia Chicken Marketing Board (BCCMB) made under the disaster flocks provisions (Part 31) of the British Columbia Chicken Marketing Board General Orders (August 26, 2011). The BCCMB ordered Wingtat to purchase product from Stasis Farm Ltd. as shipped on October 2015, and to pay Stasis an amount calculated using the same methodology as used for two other disaster flock shipments (August and September, 2015), making a 100% deduction for utility grade product.
- On behalf of the appellant Wingtat Game Bird Packers, Eric Ng, President, confirmed the withdrawal of the appeal in an email dated January 26, 2016.

- Section 17 of the *Administrative Tribunals Act*, SBC 2004, c. 45 provides that if an appellant withdraws an appeal, the tribunal must order that the appeal is dismissed.

THEREFORE THIS BOARD ORDERS:

- That the appeal filed on December 7, 2015 by Wingtat Game Bird Packers from the November 18, 2015 decision of the British Columbia Chicken Marketing Board is hereby dismissed
