
Heritage Grants from Granting Organizations & Local Governments

297 total applications were received by granting organizations and local governments for heritage-related programs and 51% of those applications were funded in 2019.



For every \$1 granted to heritage projects, an additional \$2.07 was generated by the grant recipients

Sources of additional investment include self-funding, other grants, and incentives such as tax abatements.
