

Schedule of Public Debt
Pursuant to Section 70(2) of the *Financial Administration Act*, 1996
for the Fiscal Year Ended March 31, 2000
(Unaudited)

Public debt represents direct debt obligations of the Province of British Columbia, including borrowings incurred for re-lending to authorized government bodies and for borrowings in advance of future requirements under the Warehouse Program. Public debt is reported using two categories: taxpayer-supported and self-supported. Taxpayer-supported debt includes direct debt used for government operating and capital purposes, and the debt of Crown corporations and agencies that require an operating or debt service subsidy from the government. Self-supported debt includes the debt of commercial Crown corporations and agencies and the debt of the Warehouse Program.
