Multi-factor authentication (MFA) is the practice of using more than one type of identification for users to verify their identity before accessing a device or application - including social media applications.

The first three types of MFA are:

- **Type 1: Something you know (a username or password).**
- **Type 2: Something you have (a government-issued piece of ID, a credit card, cookies on a computer, or a one-time password an application might send you via text or email).**
- **Type 3: Something you are (a biometric factor, such as a fingerprint, an iris scan, or facial recognition scan).**

- c) **A fingerprint and password.**
- d) **A facial recognition scan and username.**
