Inmates residing at NCC are mandated to participate in classroom and work programs. As such, NCC staff lead a variety of unique forestry and parks projects as well as programs for the surrounding community.

Your communication and relationship skills will assist you in providing direct supervision of inmates and in developing productive and professional relationships. Supportive colleagues will encourage your creativity in inmate programming and staff functions.

Types of staff positions:

- » Living Unit: supervises inmates in dorm-like residences
- » Program & Recreation: supervises inmate activities outside of living units
- » Healthcare: works with healthcare professionals and supervises inmates receiving medical treatment
- » Maintenance: instructs and supervises work crews
- » Inmate Programs: delivers and facilitates classroom programs

Basic employee requirements — you:

- » are a Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- » possess a valid B.C. class 5 driver's licence

Steps of the employment application process:

- Online application: fill out and submit an online application and recruitment questionnaire
- 2. Interview: if suitable, you will be contacted to schedule an interview
- Screenings: participate in a set of screenings, including physical abilities (COPAT), language proficiency (LPI), computer voice stress analysis (CVSA), vision and medical tests
- 4. Background checks: include references, credit checks and a criminal record search
- 5. First aid: have or obtain valid first aid (OFA) certification
