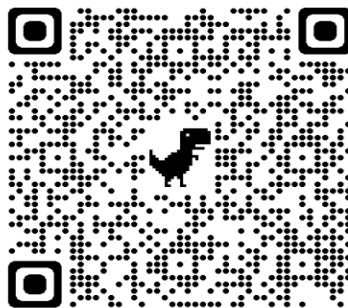

Regional Ambassador Frequently Asked Questions

What is a regional ambassador?

A regional ambassador is an experienced sheriff able to help those interested in employment with the BC Sheriff Service to navigate the recruitment process and role expectations. The program is intended as an avenue for those interested in joining the BC Sheriff Service to gain more insight to inform their decision-making and clarify aspects of the recruitment process and role.

How do I contact a regional ambassador?

You can connect with a regional ambassador by emailing BCSheriffs@gov.bc.ca and indicating in which region you live. If you are contacting us from out-of-province, you may indicate in which region you're interested in applying to. The recruitment office will then connect you with a regional ambassador in your area.

Regional ambassadors also regularly attend recruitment events across the province. If you see an ambassador at an event, it is a great opportunity to introduce yourself and ask any questions you may have.

How do I know if I meet the minimum application requirements before being connected with a regional ambassador?

- You must be 19 years of age
- You must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- You must have successfully completed Grade 12 or equivalent (GED, adult Dogwood)
- You must be able to obtain and maintain a valid unrestricted Class 4 licence prior to training with the BC Sheriff Service (a learner's licence is sufficient during the initial stages of the hiring process)
