All Indigenous not for profit eligible applicants (with a central mandate that improves Indigenous outcomes) are required to submit an endorsement letter from the benefitting Indigenous community/nation supporting the project.
Reminder: The electronic submission of the application in the Local Government Information System serves as an attestation that the organization and senior official as approving the project application, having a confirmed budget and keeping <u>all applicable records</u> on the project file, if requested:
keep on file, the authorization of a senior official sign off for the project to proceed.
keep on file, a confirmed budget with details that funding is available to cover ongoing project operations and maintenance costs.
If applicable keep on file appropriate documentation to meet all required federal or provincial licenses, approvals or permits (e.g. local Health Authorities, Ministry of Environment, Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada, Ministry of Transportation).
If applicable keep on file documentation to detail health or environmental problems from relevant regulatory agencies (e.g. non-compliance orders, regulatory agency report).

Unique Heritage Infrastructure projects/initiatives support Cultural recovery through investment in unique heritage infrastructure. Indigenous applicants, seeking funding under the Unique Heritage Infrastructure stream, are encouraged to apply through the First Peoples' Cultural Council's online grant portal.
Project is shovel ready/worthy, with construction start in calendar year 2021.
Project is completed before March 31, 2023.
As a condition of the grant, all recipients will be required to submit a Final Report Form with a summary of expenditures detailing the project's performance. Applicants should ensure that the means to collect and provide the data is in place. For projects that extend beyond one calendar year, an annual progress report will be required.
