TRAX Data Submission Guide: Course Equivalency and Challenge

Students may earn credits toward graduation in a variety of ways, including through Equivalency and Challenge. The <u>B.C. Graduation Program Handbook of Procedures</u> (Chapter 3: Options for Earning Credits) instructs schools how to report course credit granted via an Equivalency review or Challenge process to TRAX.

Why is it important for schools to correctly report a course equivalency or challenge?

Correctly reporting a course equivalency or challenge ensures student transcripts are complete and accurate.

For course credits earned through equivalency, a missing 'E' indicator can create challenges for students applying to post-secondary institutions. For example, if a student has a transcript from another jurisdiction showing courses completed, a post-secondary institution may have concerns if the same courses also appear on the student's B.C. transcript without the 'E' indicator.

The Ministry of Education and Child Care staff also review course and enrolment history as part of the <u>Grade 10 Literacy exemption process</u> for students transferring to B.C. from another jurisdiction. Missing 'E' indicators can also delay the successful application of an LTE10 or LTP10 exemption.

For courses completed through the challenge process, the Ministry funds enrolling boards of education the equivalent per pupil funding of a 1-credit course for each successfully completed course challenge.

How is an Equivalency or Challenge noted on a Student Transcript?

When correctly reported, an 'E' or 'C' will appear under the EQU column on a student transcript to indicate how the credits for that course were earned.

Does Transfer Standing (TS) mean the same thing as Equivalency?

No. Transfer Standing (TS) is a summary of learning, recognized under the Provincial Letter Grades Order. The TS indicator appears in the Final Letter Grade column on a student transcript.

TS may be used when awarding equivalency credit or credit for an external credential, and can only be granted by the principal, vice-principal, or director of instruction in charge of a school after examining the student's records from an institution other than a school as defined by the *School Act*. Alternatively, when assigning credit for an equivalent course or for an external credential, the principal, vice-principal, or director of instruction in charge after examining student records.

TS marks on a student transcript may have long-term impacts on a student's post-secondary options and can also affect the calculation of Honours status, as well as the B.C. Achievement Scholarship. TS should only be assigned when in the best interest of the student. As indicated in the Curriculum & Classroom Assessment <u>Reporting Policy</u>, whenever possible, a proficiency scale indicator or letter grade and percentage should be assigned to the student over a TS.

Should 'E' and 'TS' always appear together on a student transcript?

No. TS may be granted when awarding credit through the equivalency process, but schools are encouraged to assign a letter grade whenever possible.
