2. Please give a brief description of new initiatives implemented by school districts for French second language programs.

New AIM resources were purchased for one school for use at the elementary level. Two elementary schools are now utilizing AIM materials.

A resource decision was made district wide for Grades 8 and 9 French and those resources were acquired. They included student textbooks and ancillary resources for the teacher including CD's, DVD's and black-line masters. As our French department will be operating in the future with a single French specialist, these resources are integral for him to meet the challenges of delivering all of the Core French programming within a school as a singleton staff member in a department.

In addition, the school is moving very quickly to look at differentiated instruction and the effective use of technology. The French department is fully participating in this activity. Both current French teachers were provided with Smart Boards and In-Focus projectors and the appropriate computer hardware and software to make significant progress in the areas of E-learning for students.
