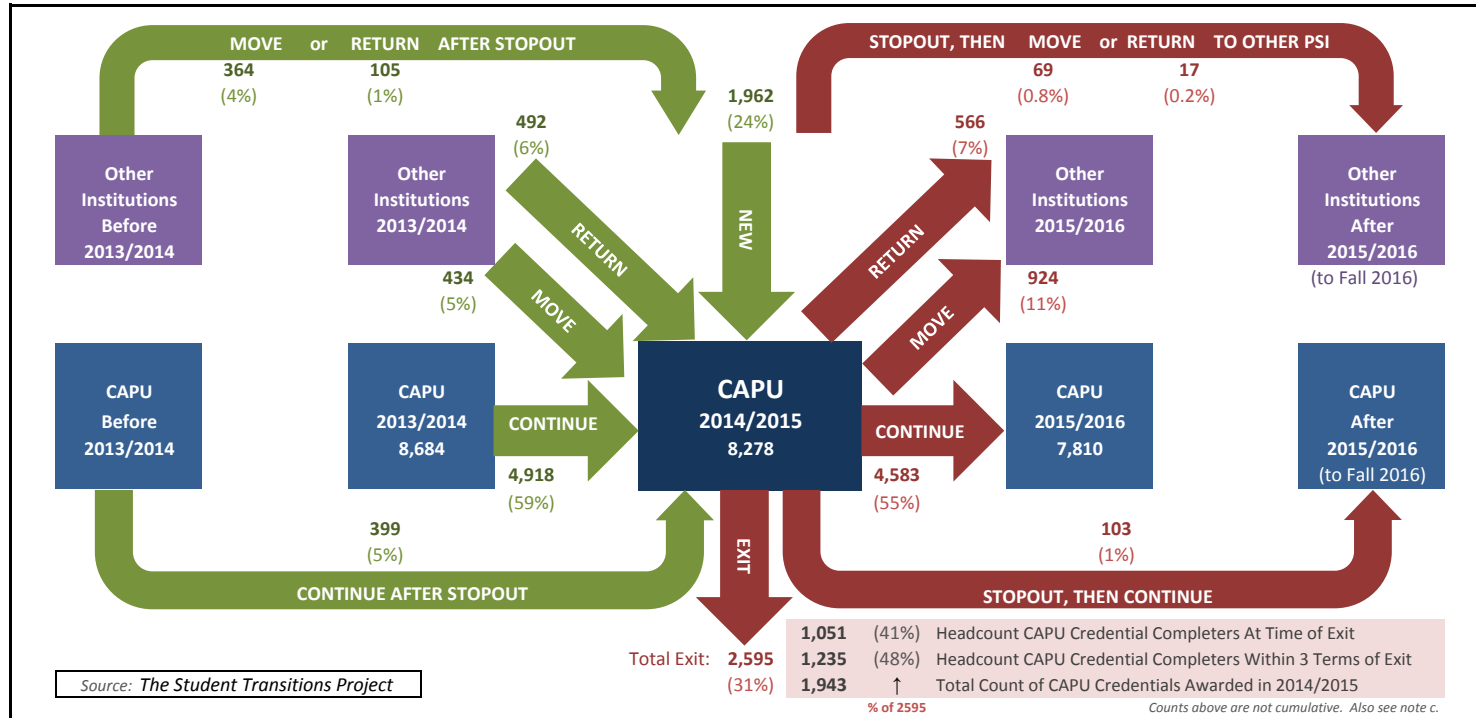

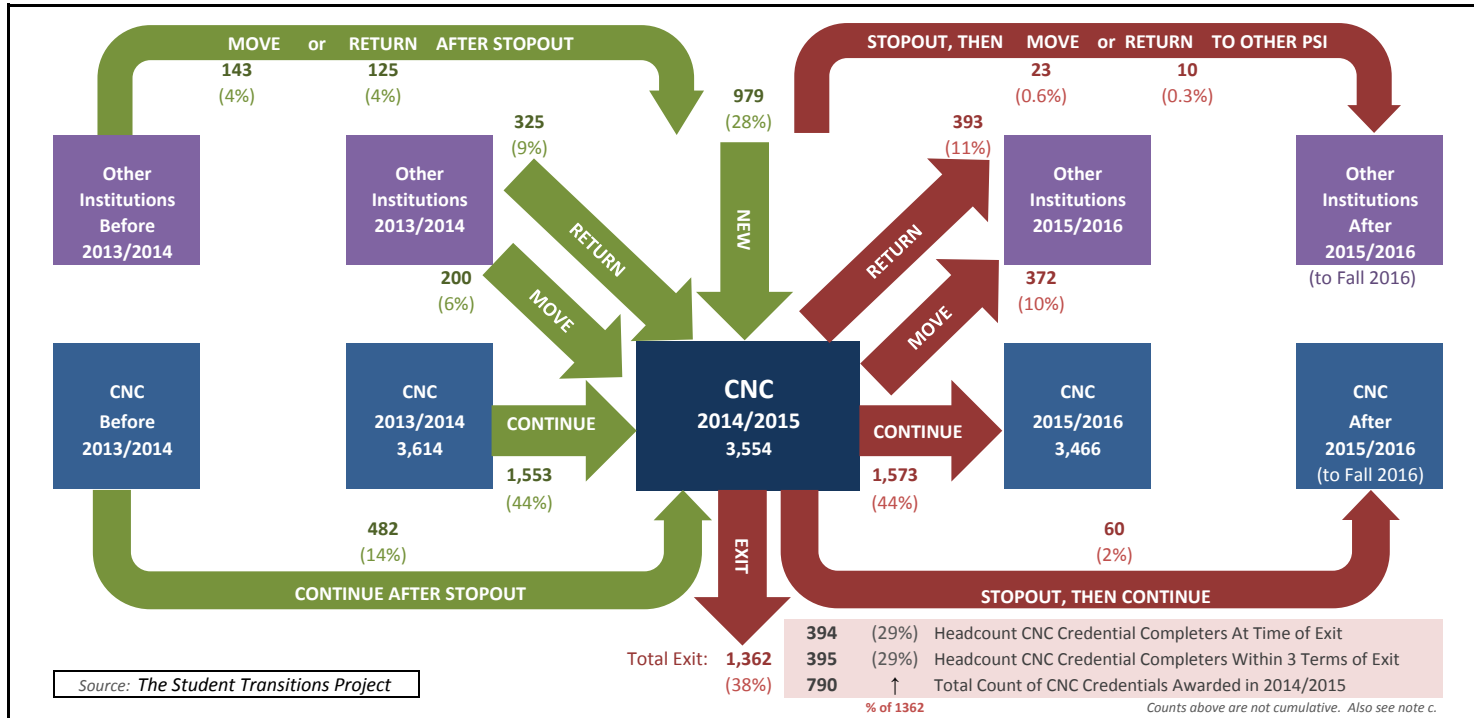

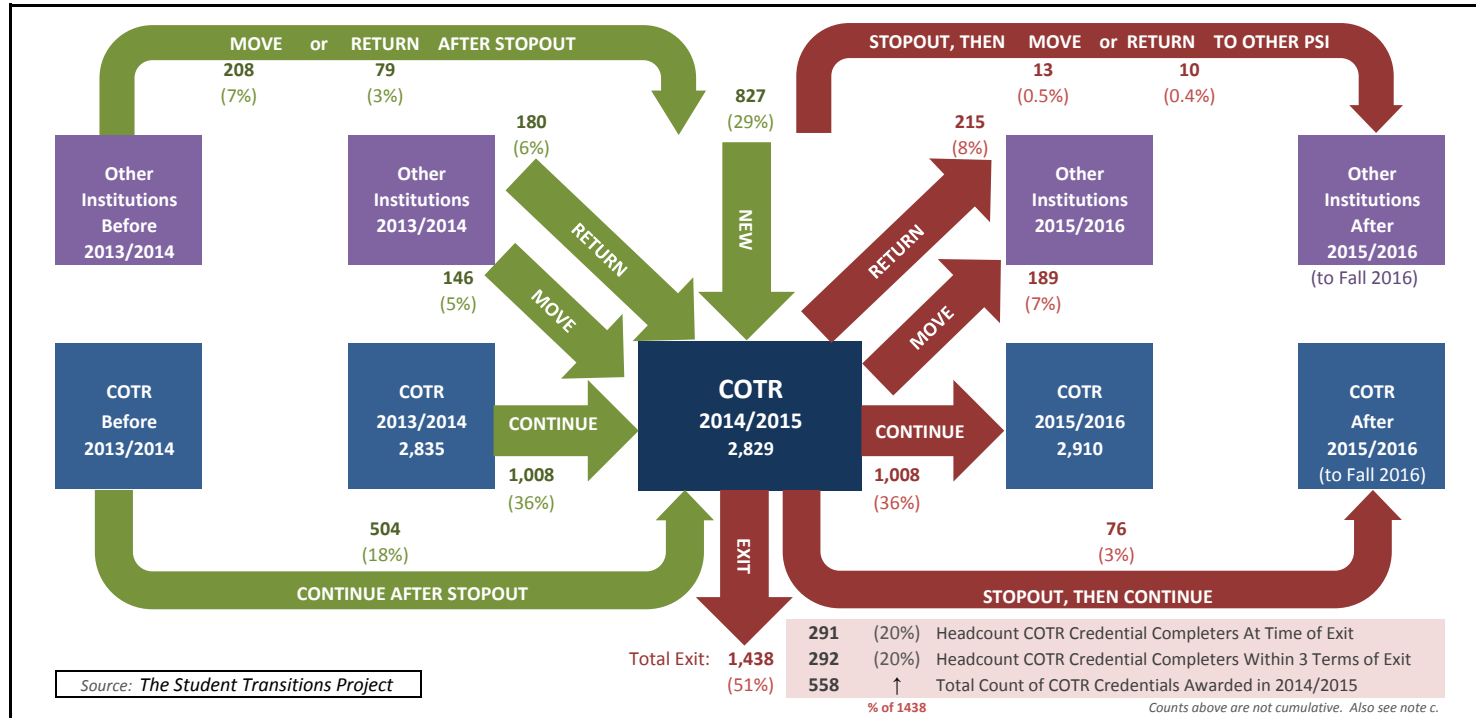

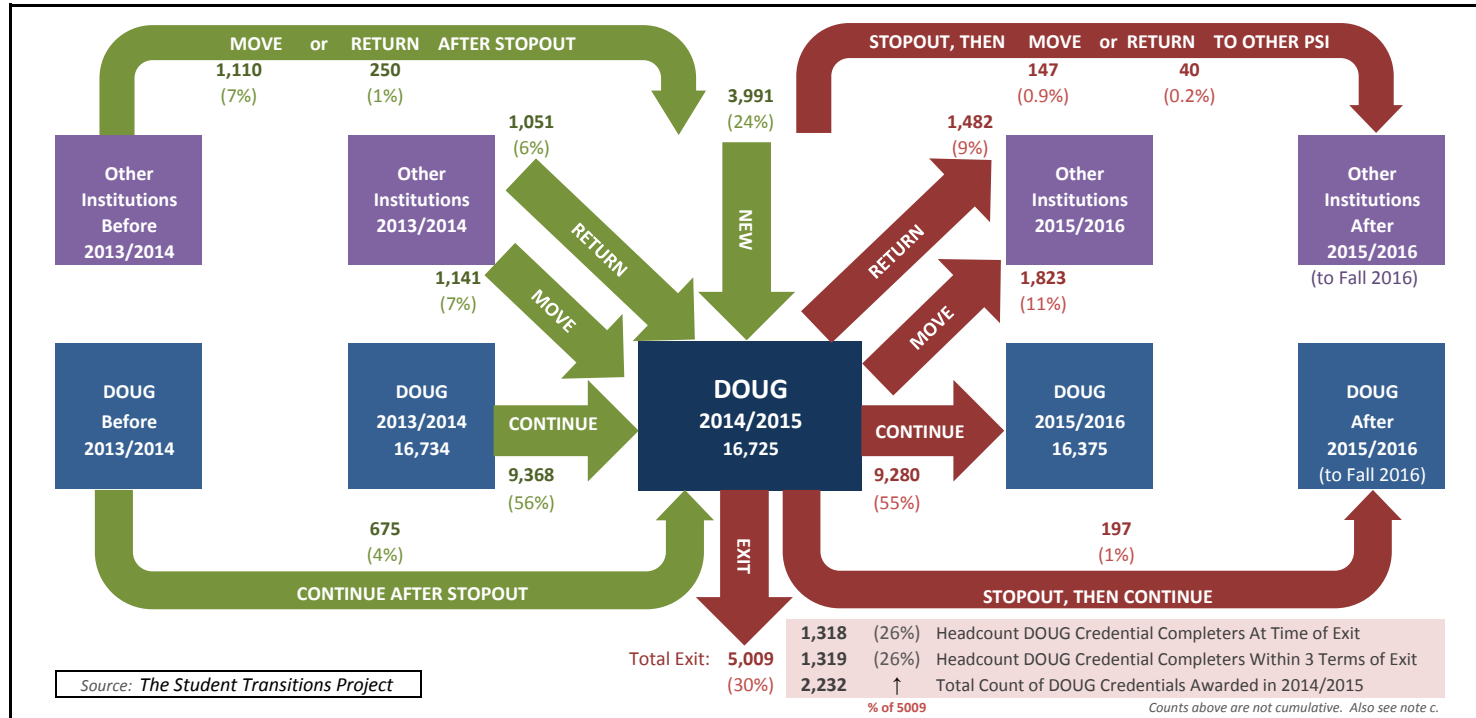

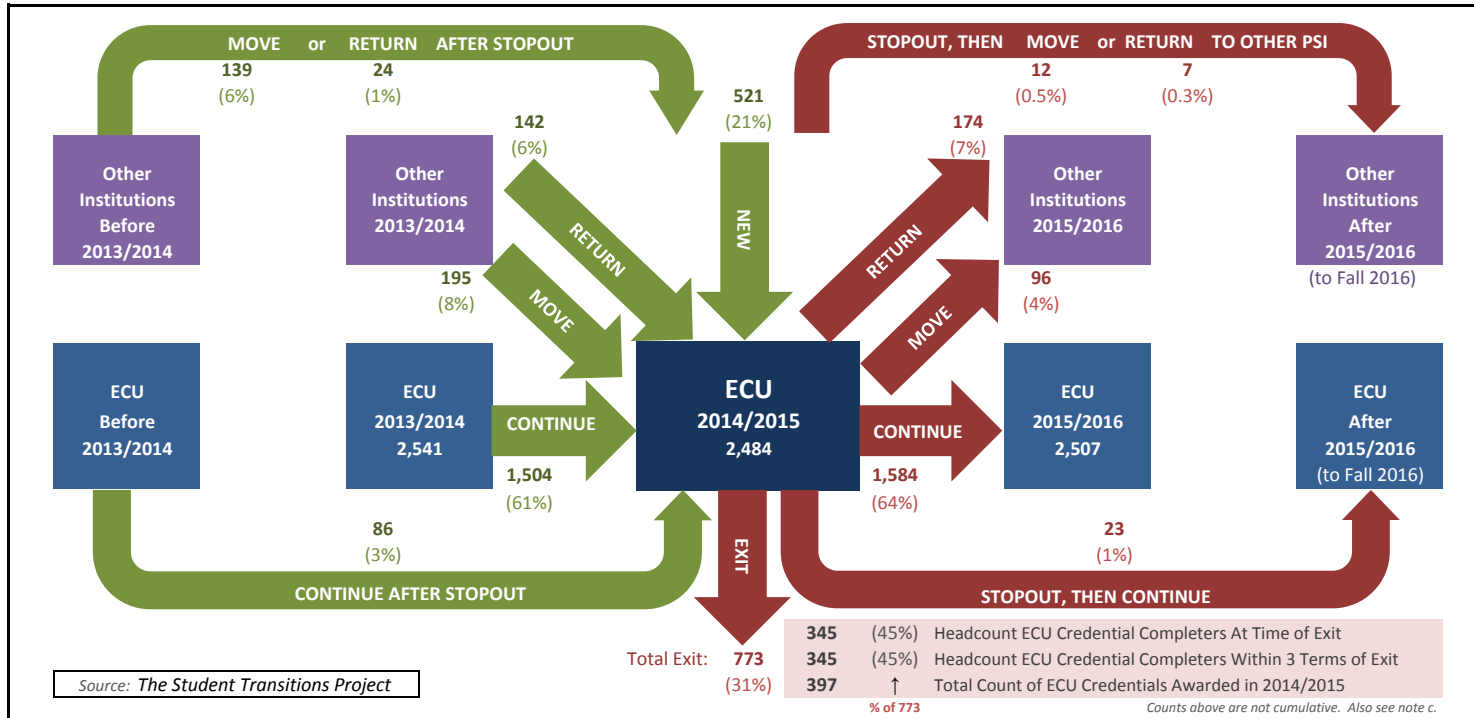

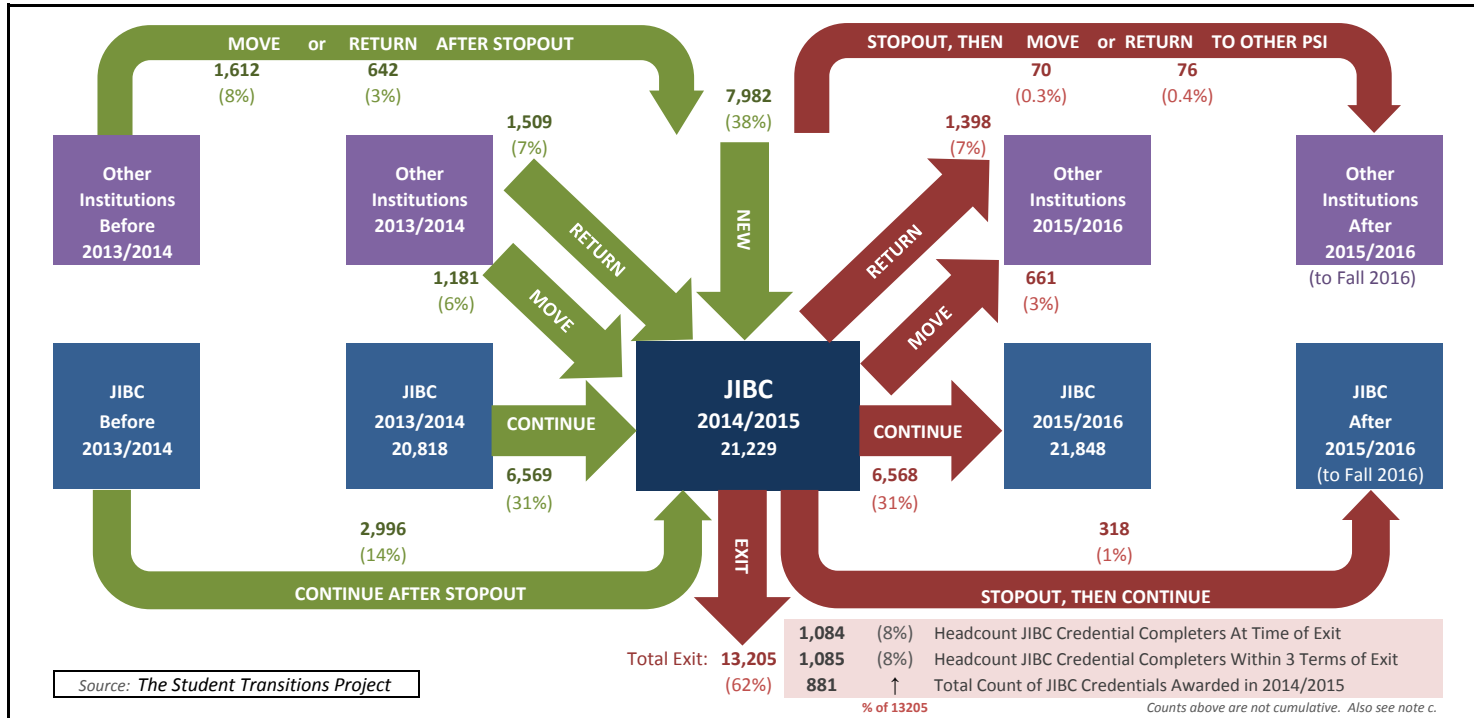

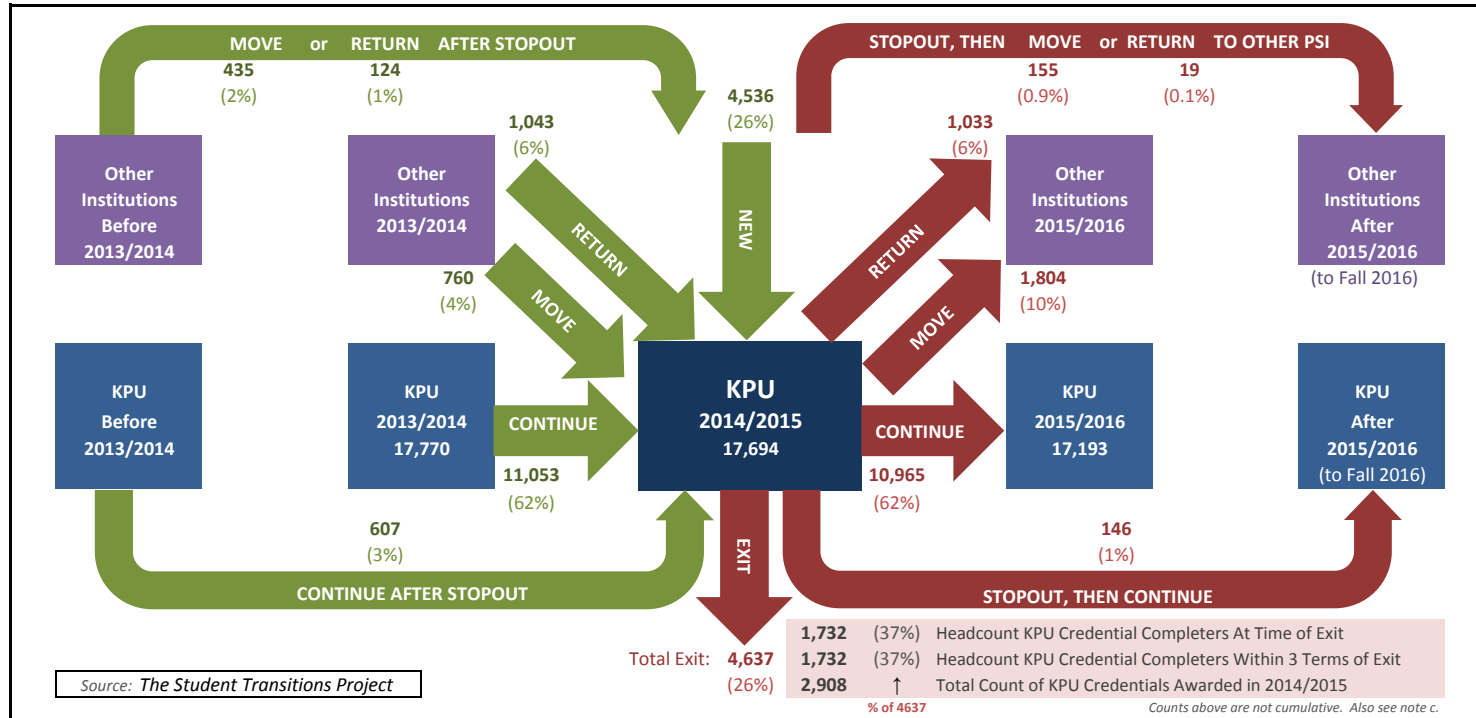

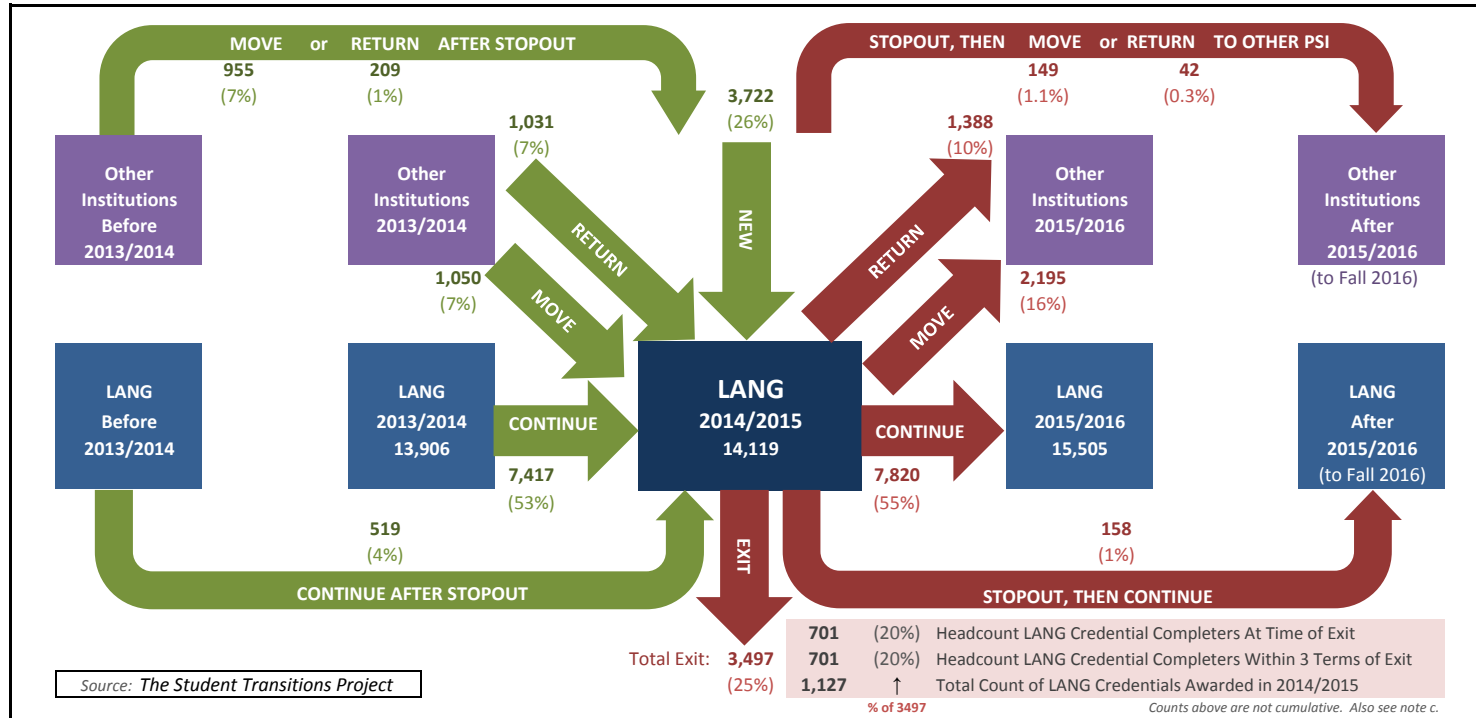

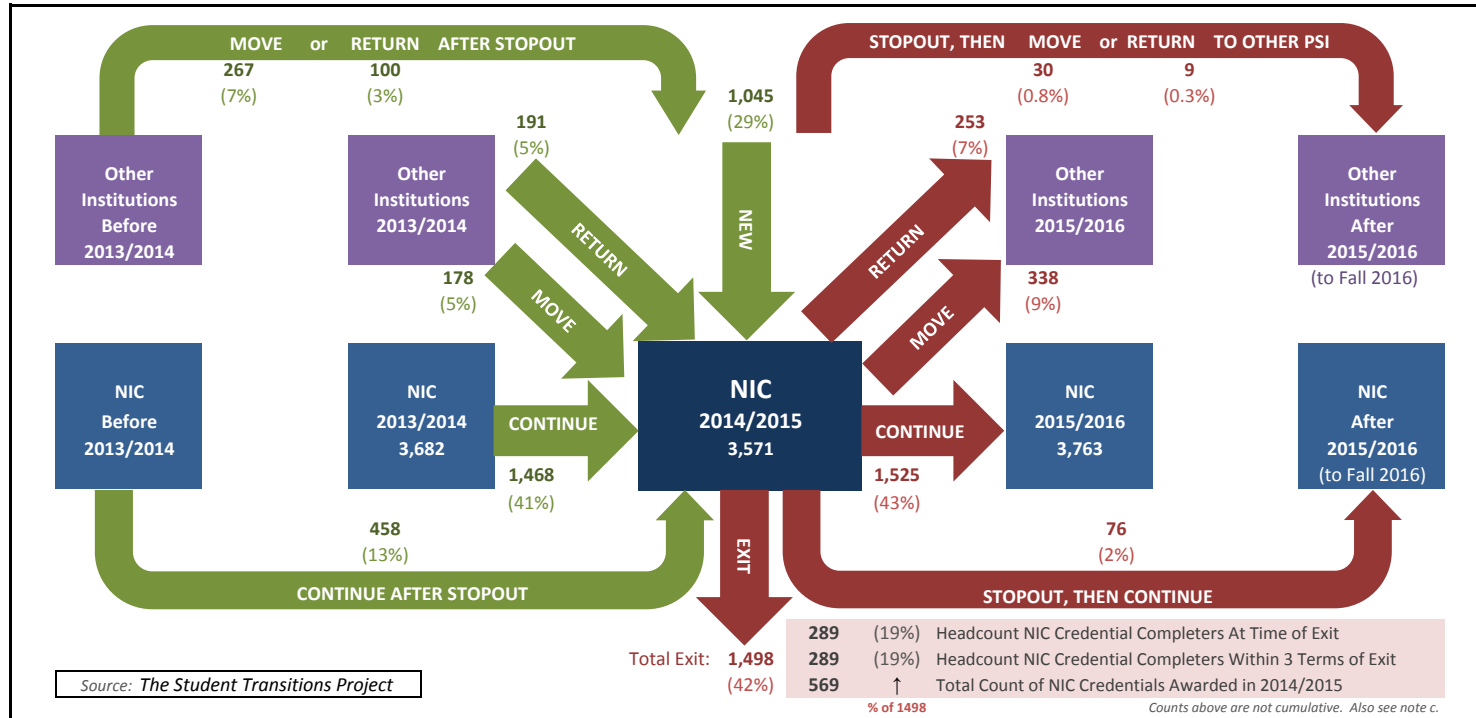

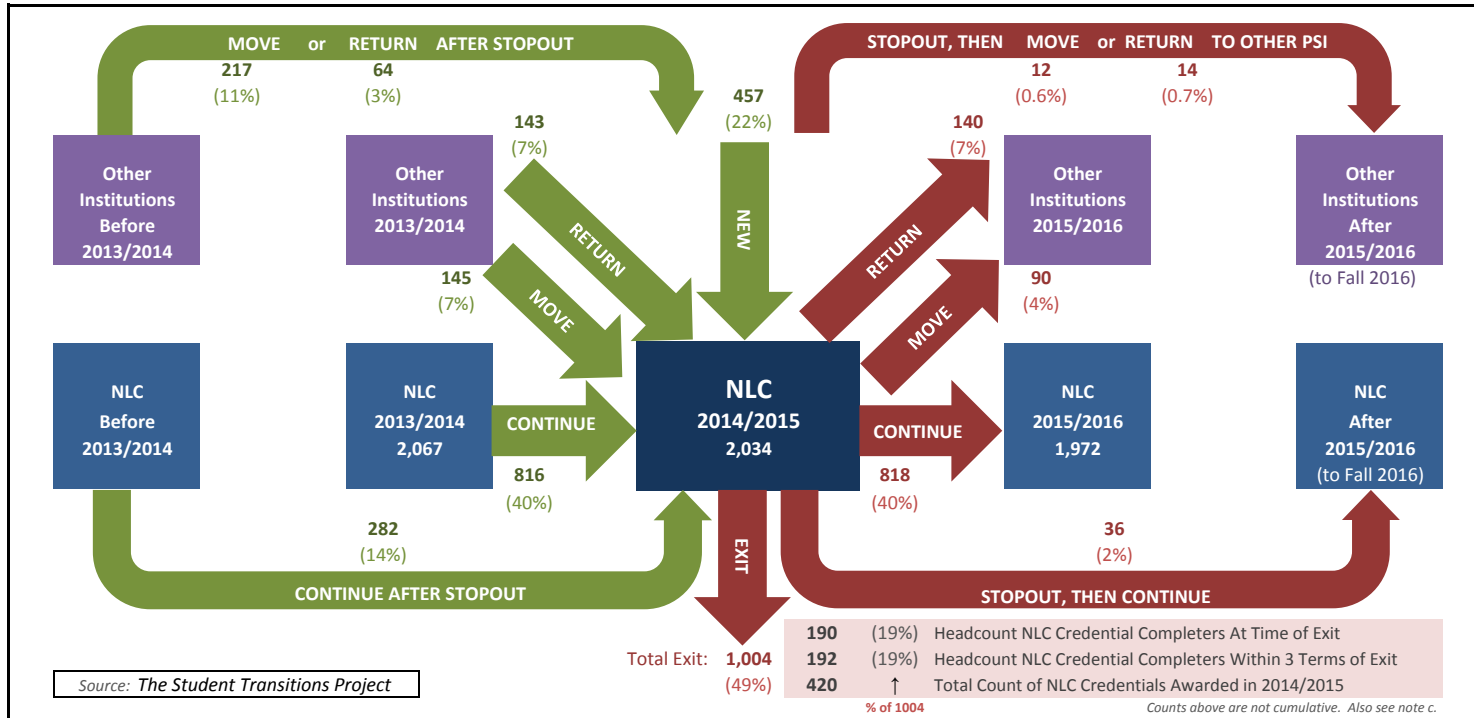

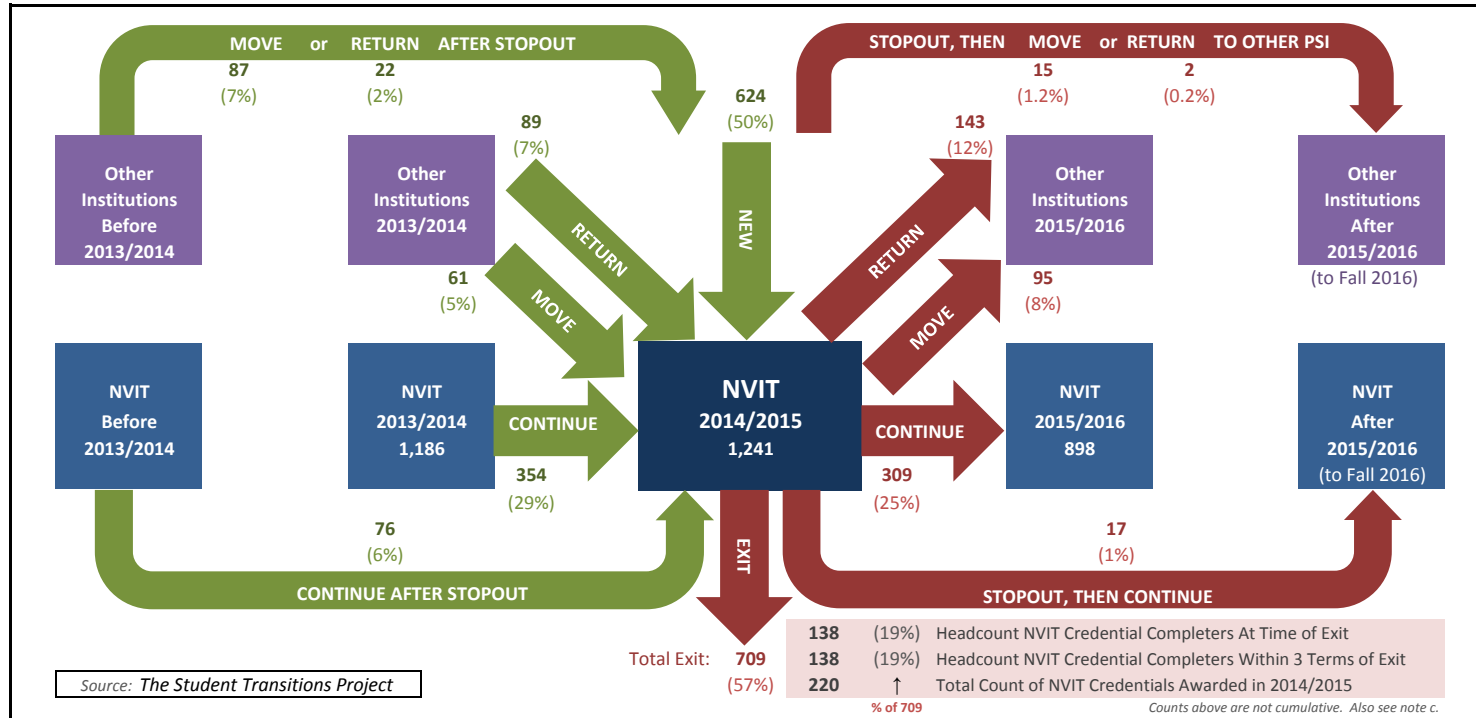

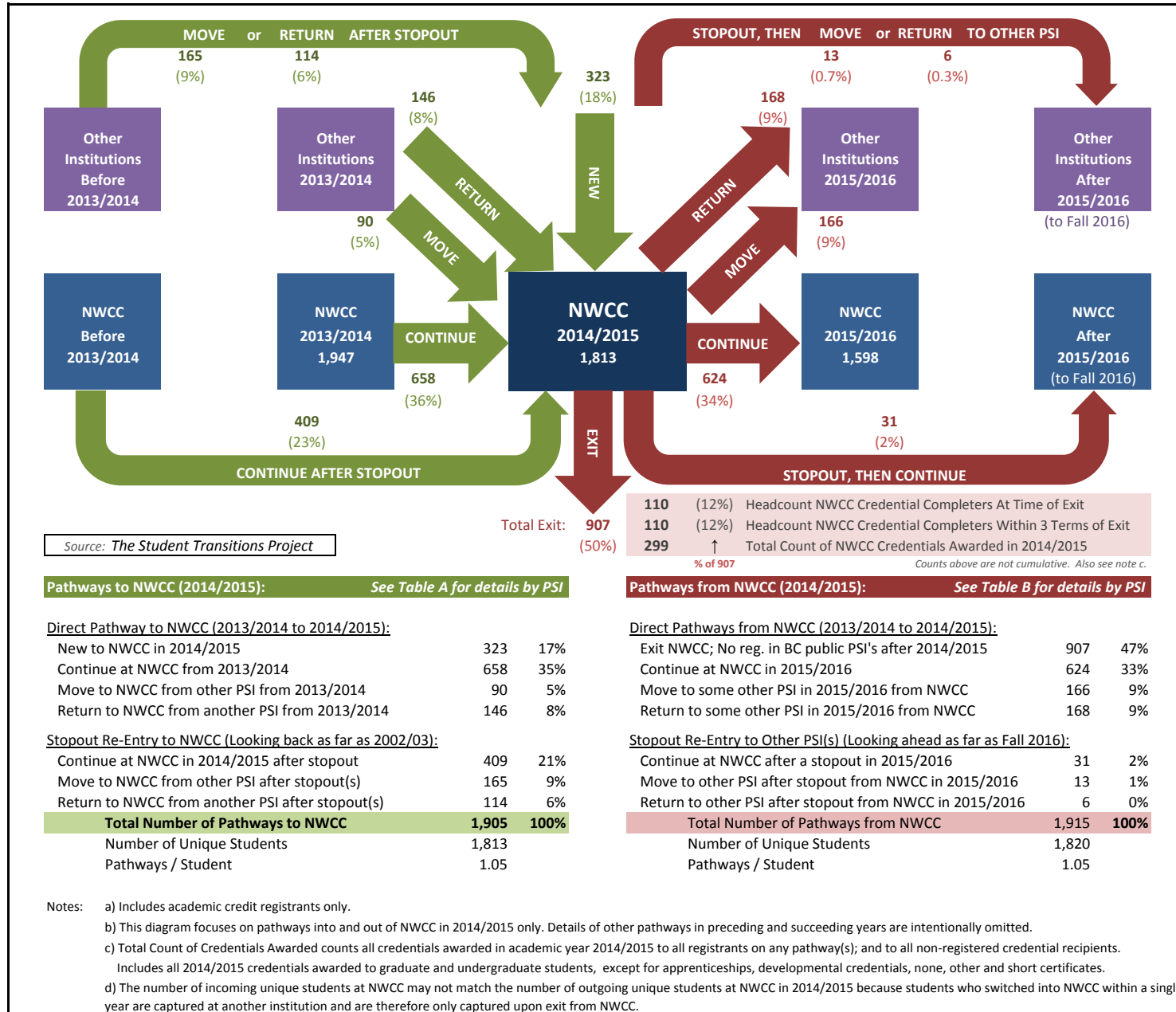

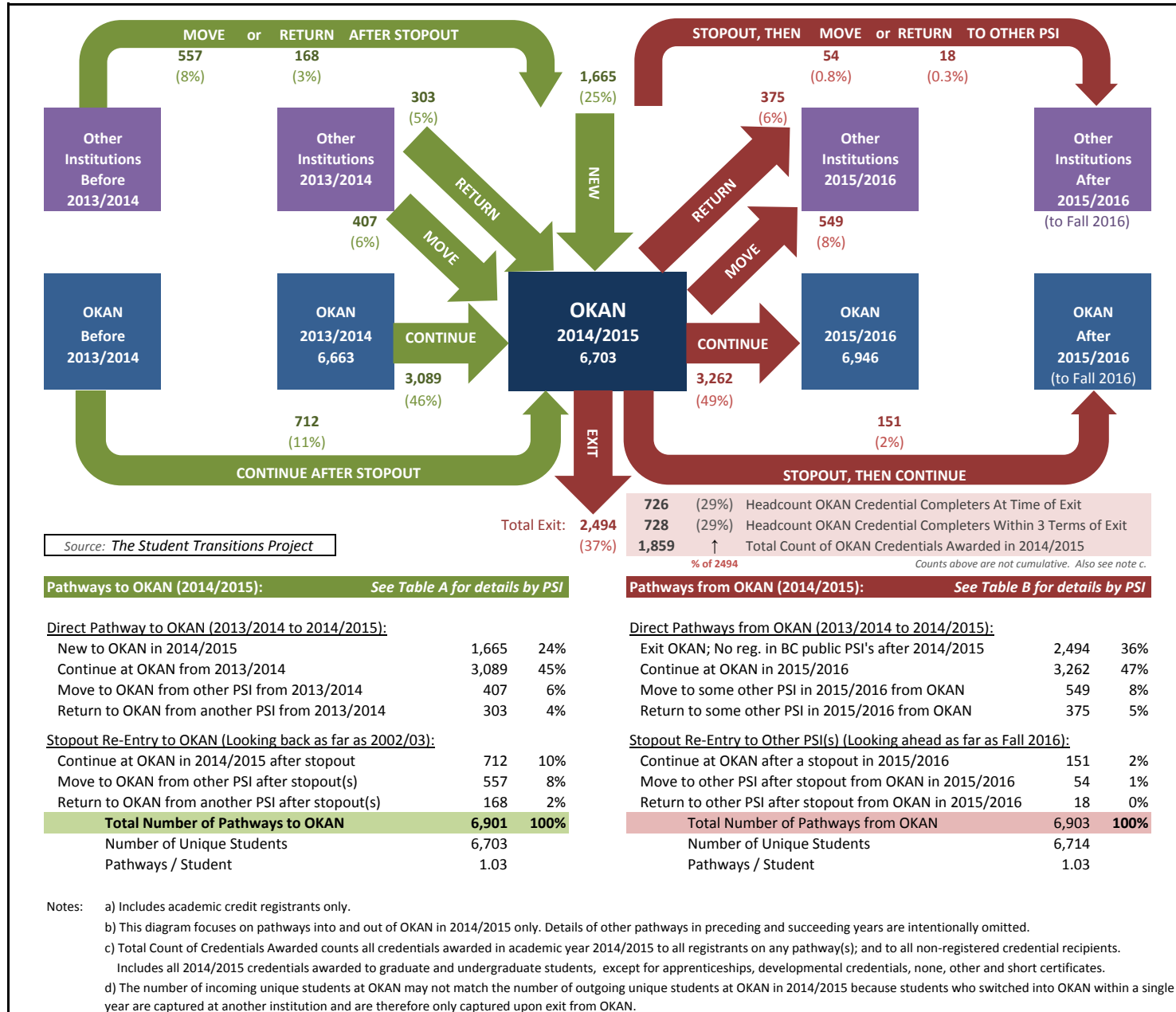

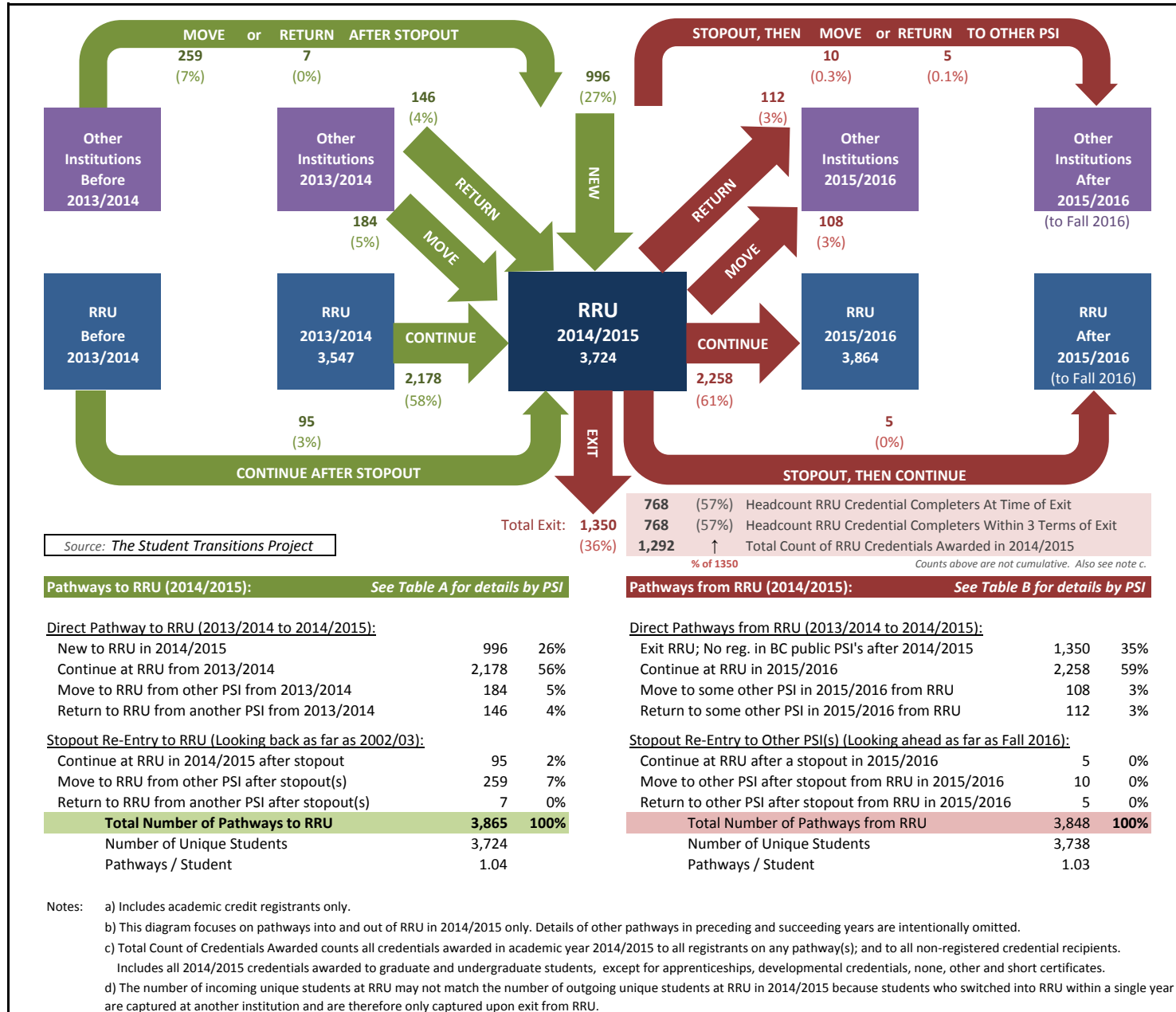
Student Pathways to Northwest Community College (NWCC) in 2014/2015 and Future Student Pathways, up to Fall 2016



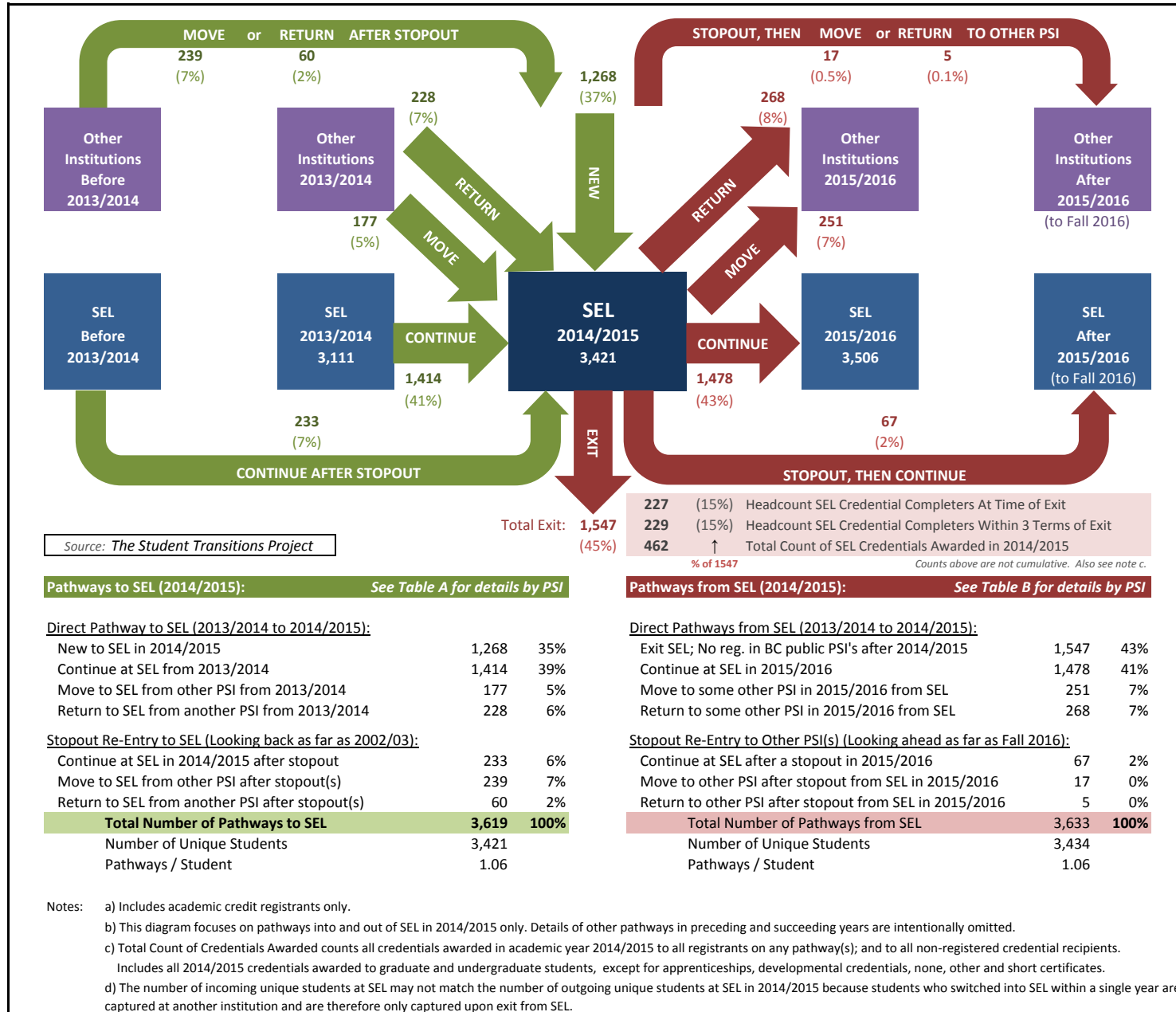
Student Pathways to Okanagan College (OKAN) in 2014/2015 and Future Student Pathways, up to Fall 2016



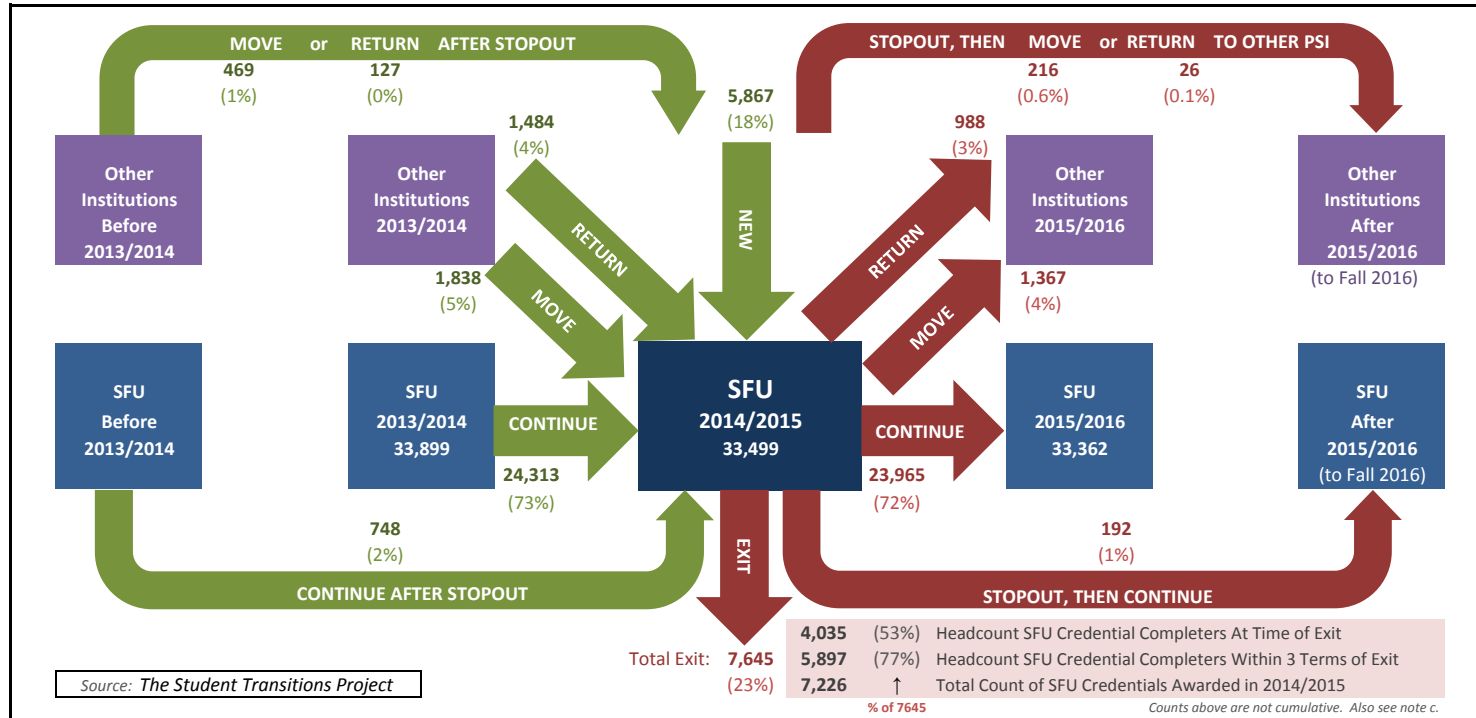
Student Pathways to Royal Roads University (RRU) in 2014/2015 and Future Student Pathways, up to Fall 2016

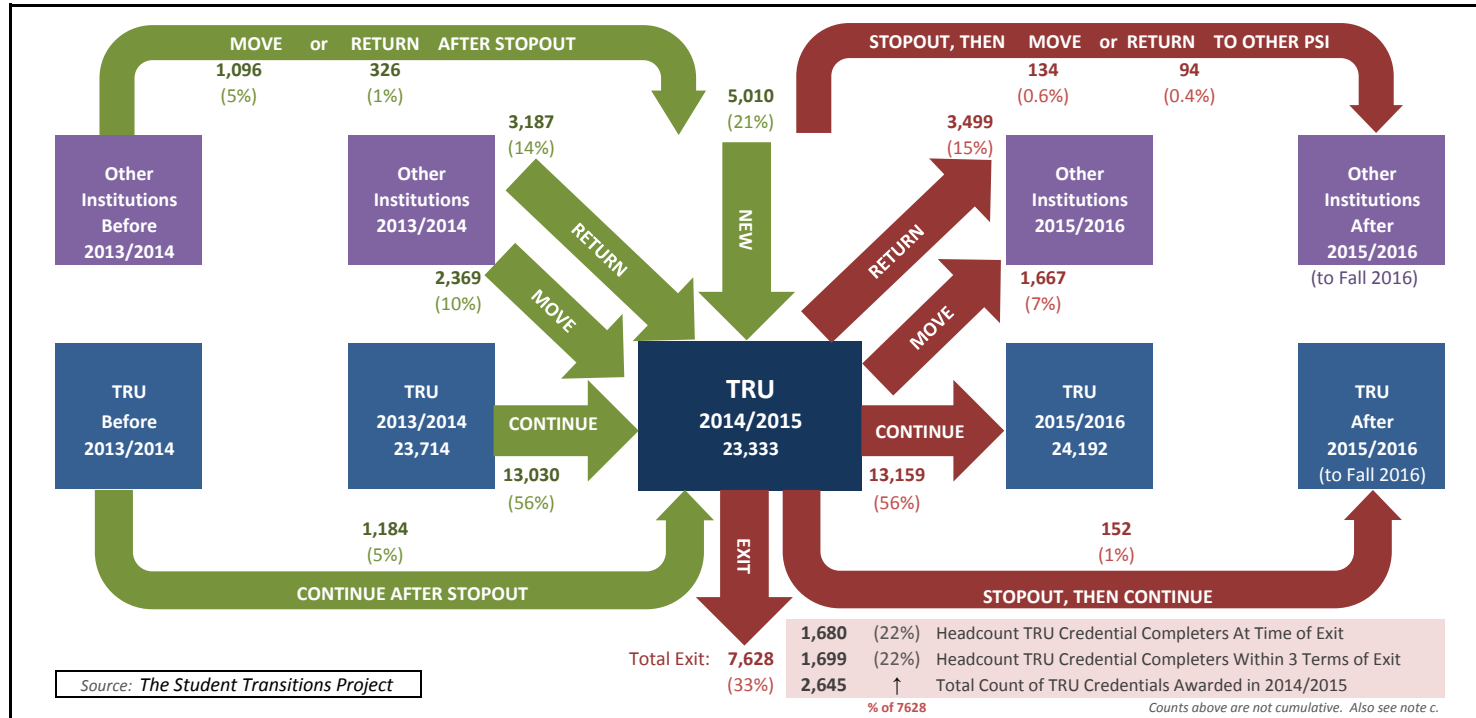

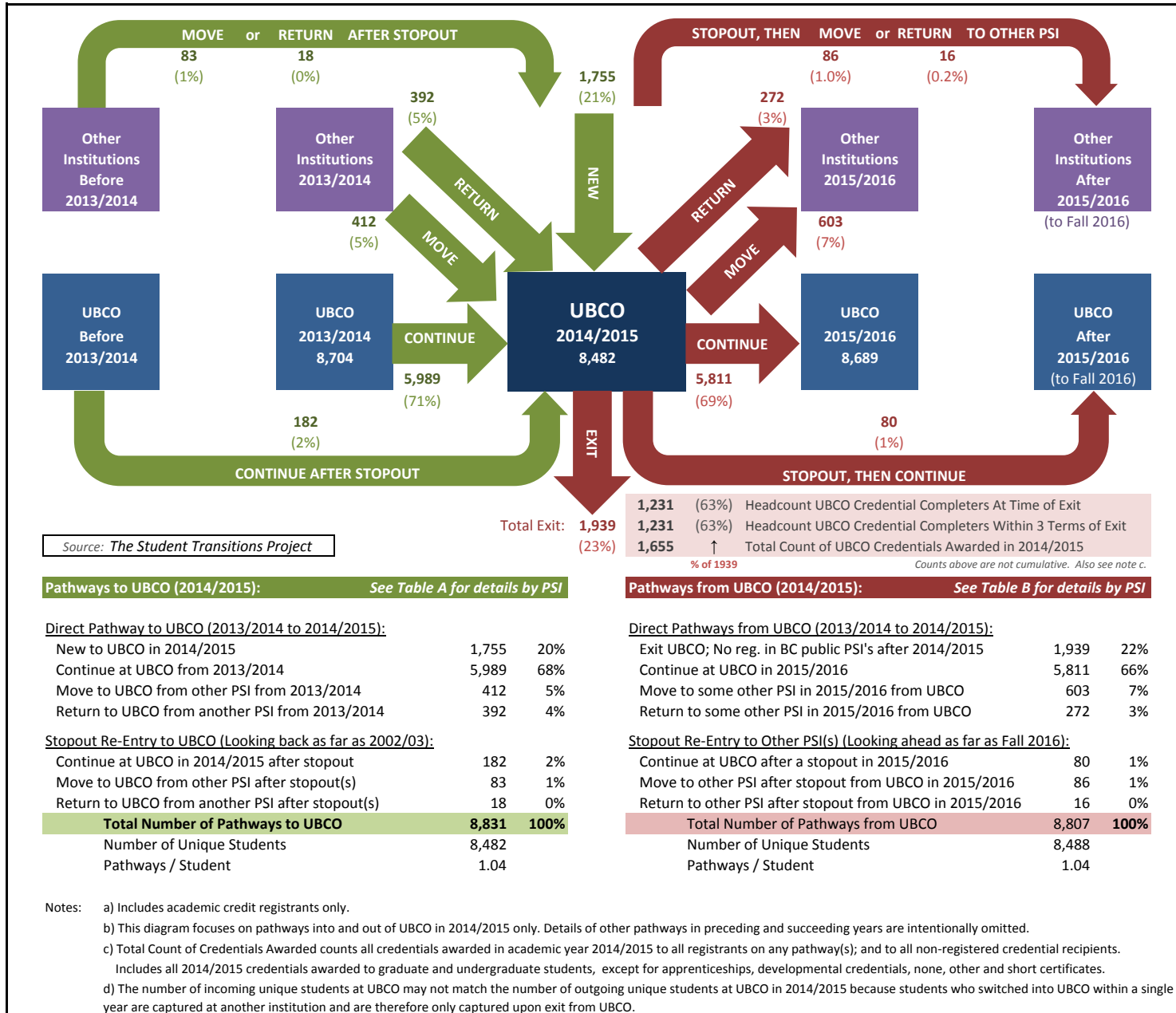

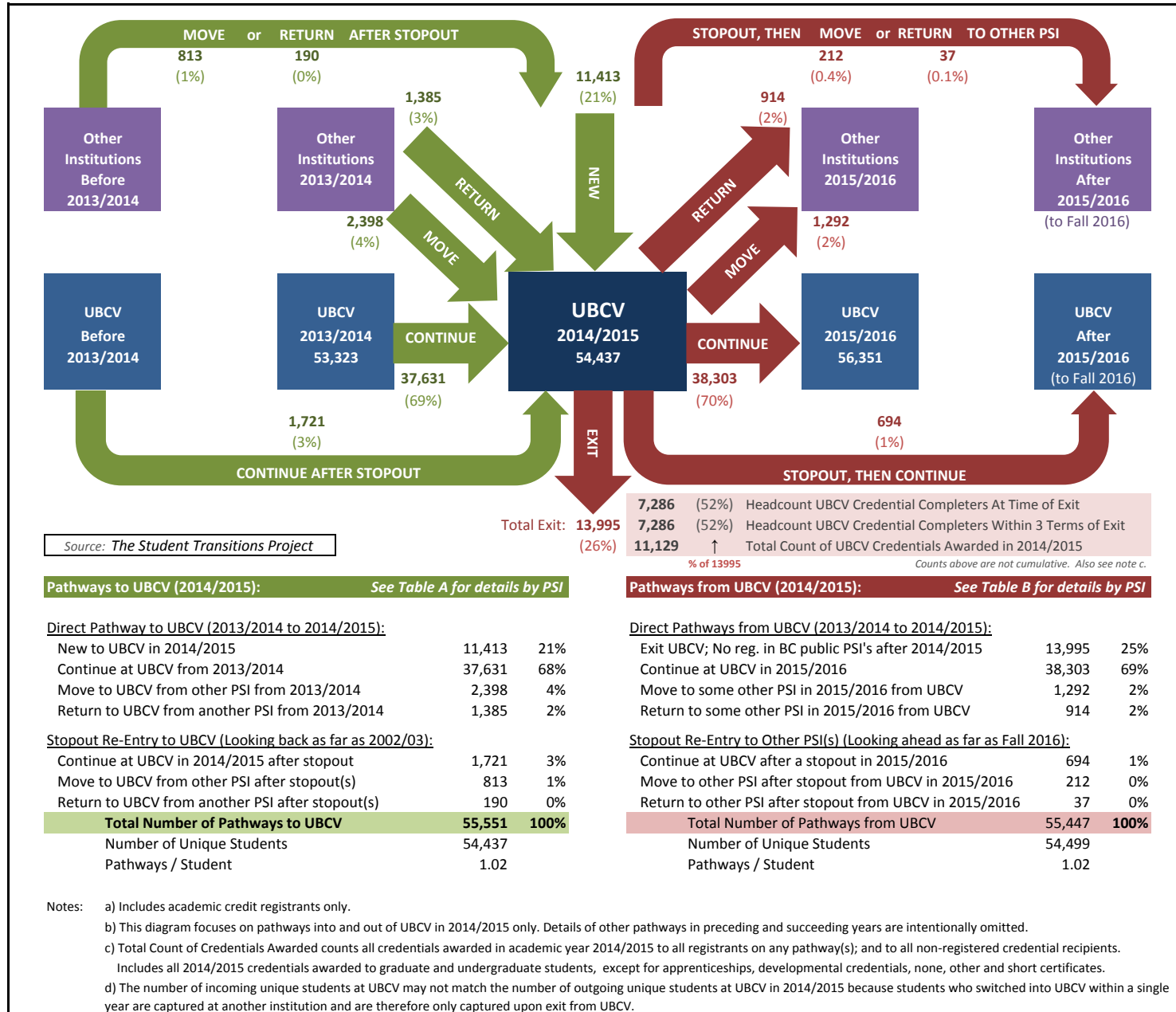

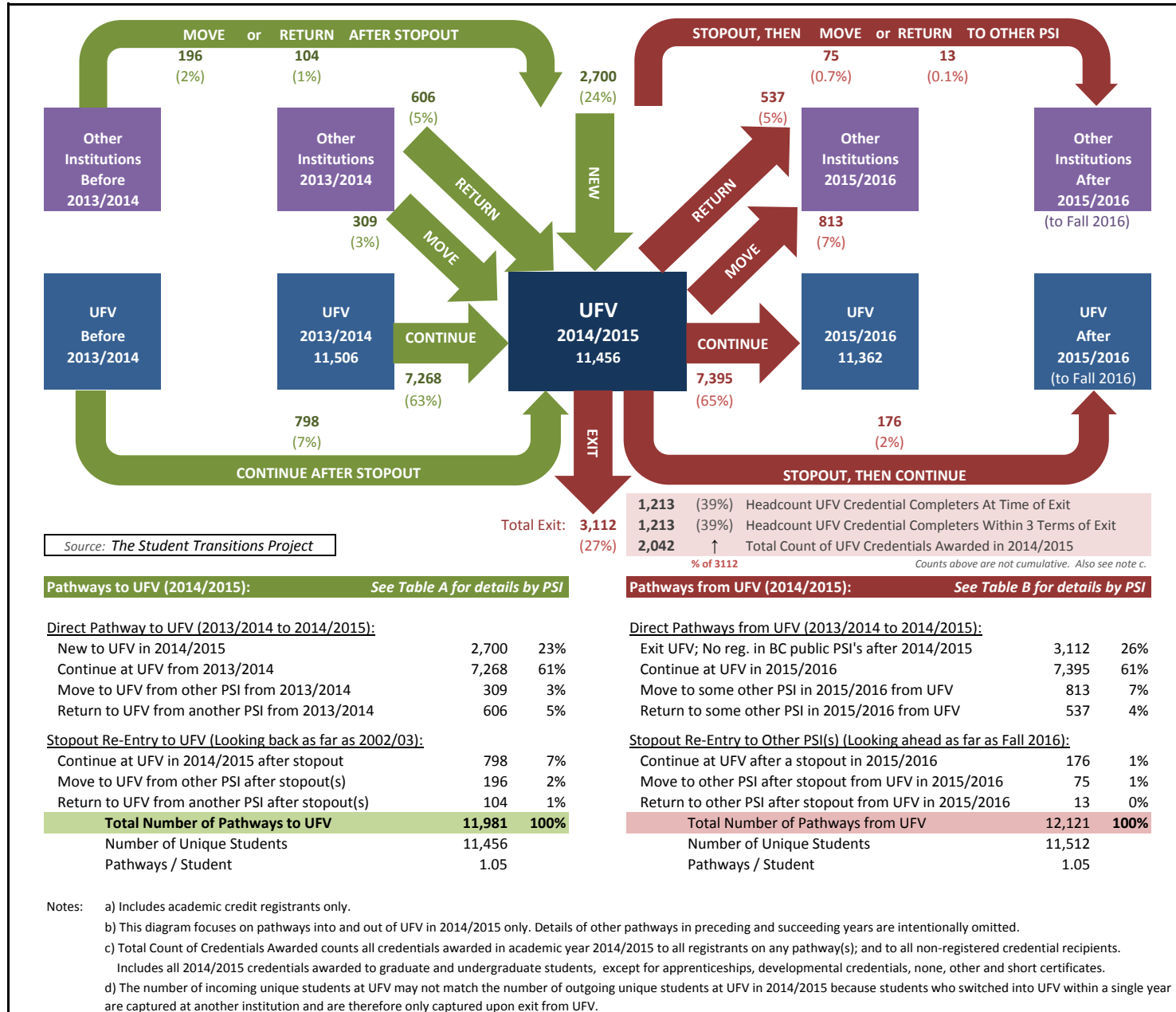
Student Pathways to University of British Columbia, Okanagan (UBCO) in 2014/2015 and Future Student Pathways, up to Fall 2016



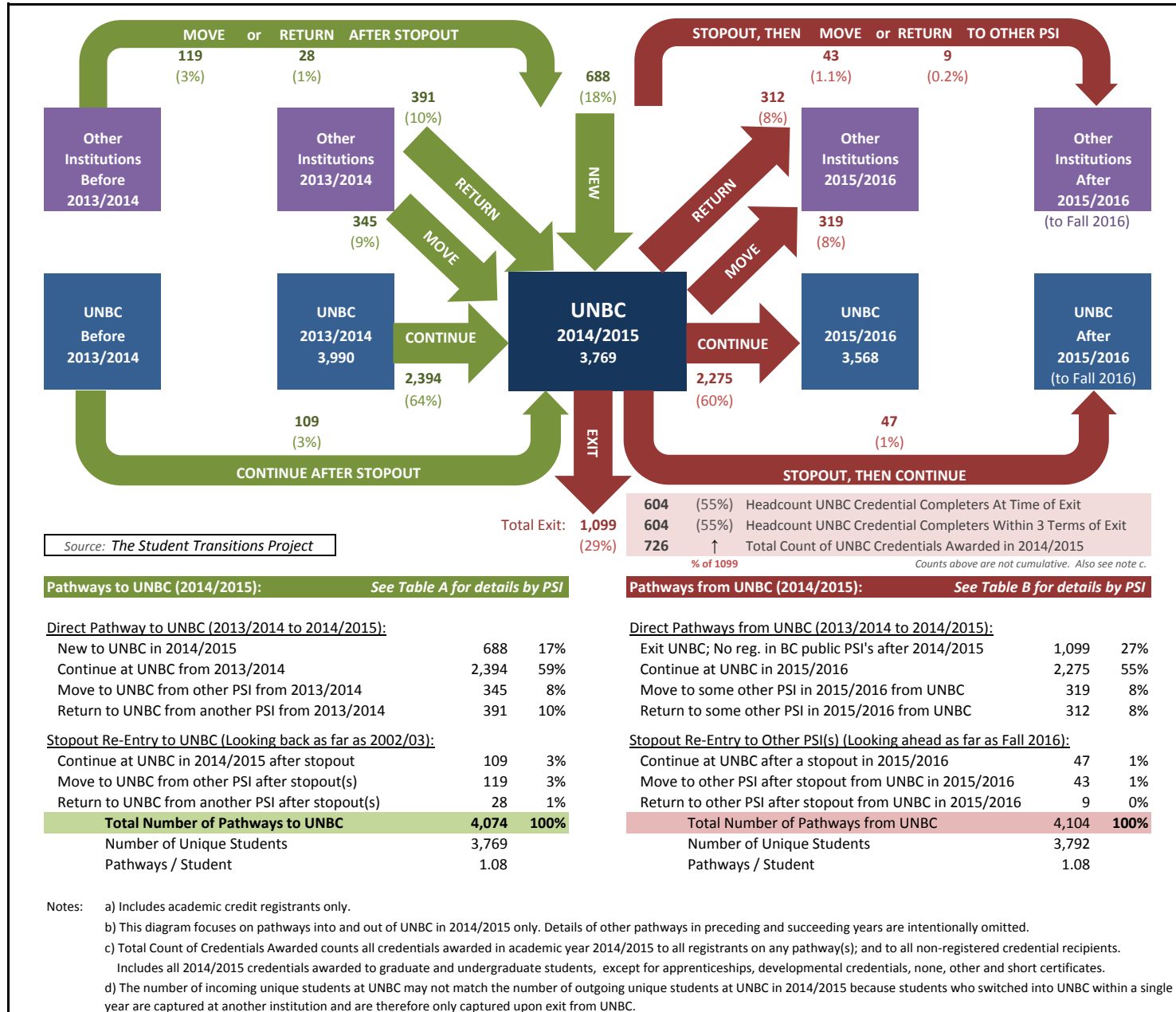
Student Pathways to University of British Columbia, Vancouver (UBCV) in 2014/2015 and Future Student Pathways, up to Fall 2016



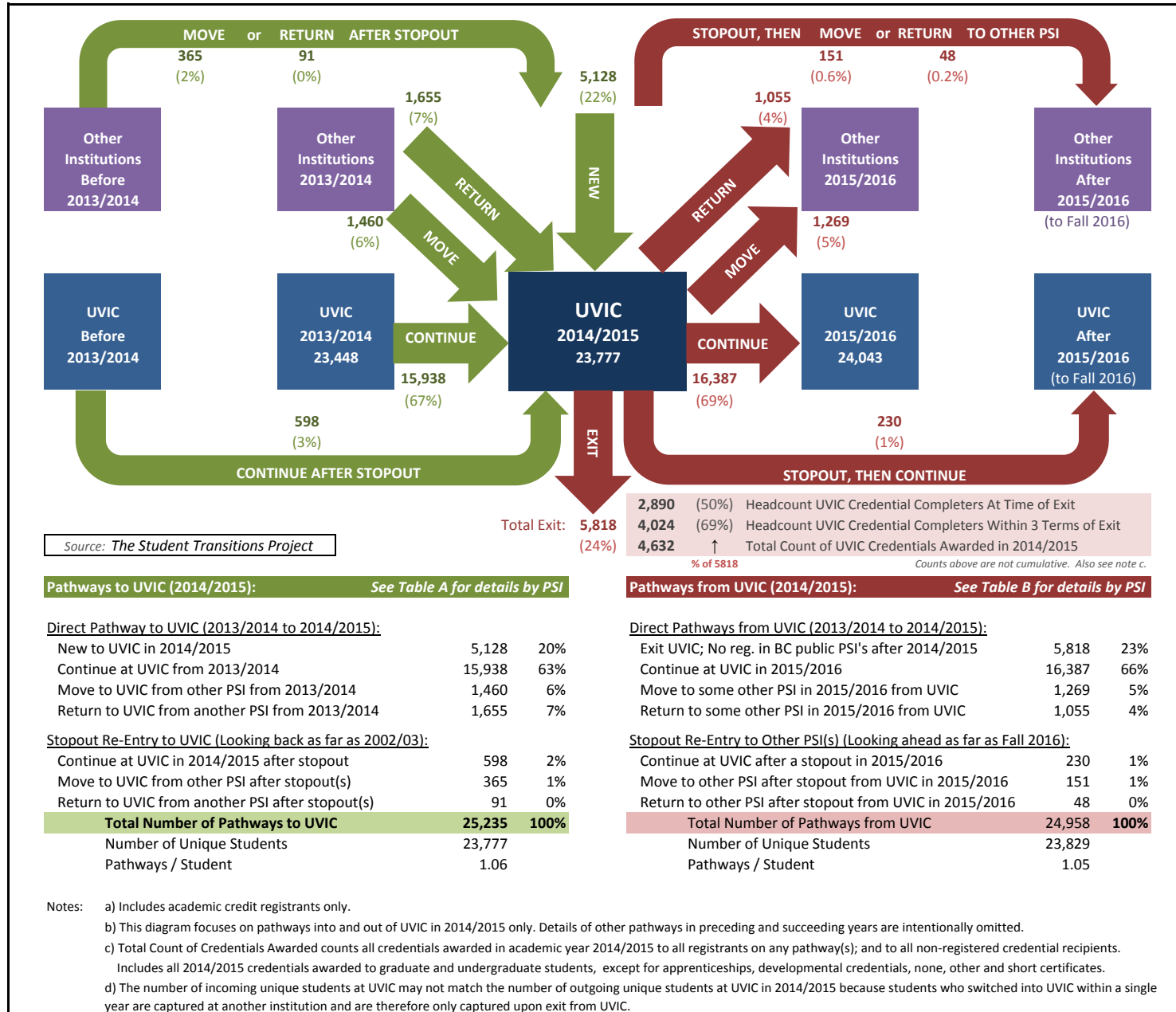
Student Pathways to University of the Fraser Valley (UFV) in 2014/2015 and Future Student Pathways, up to Fall 2016



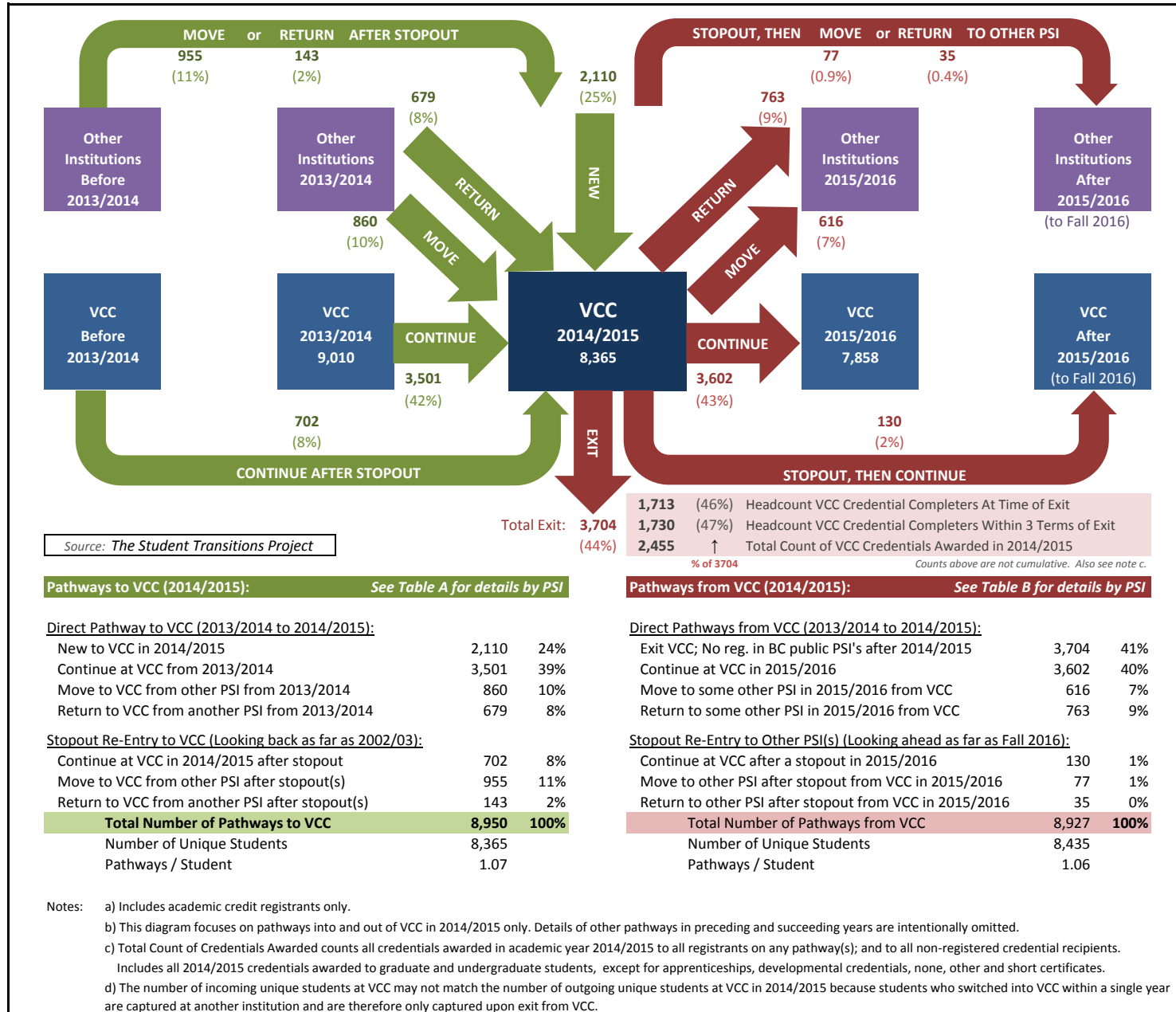

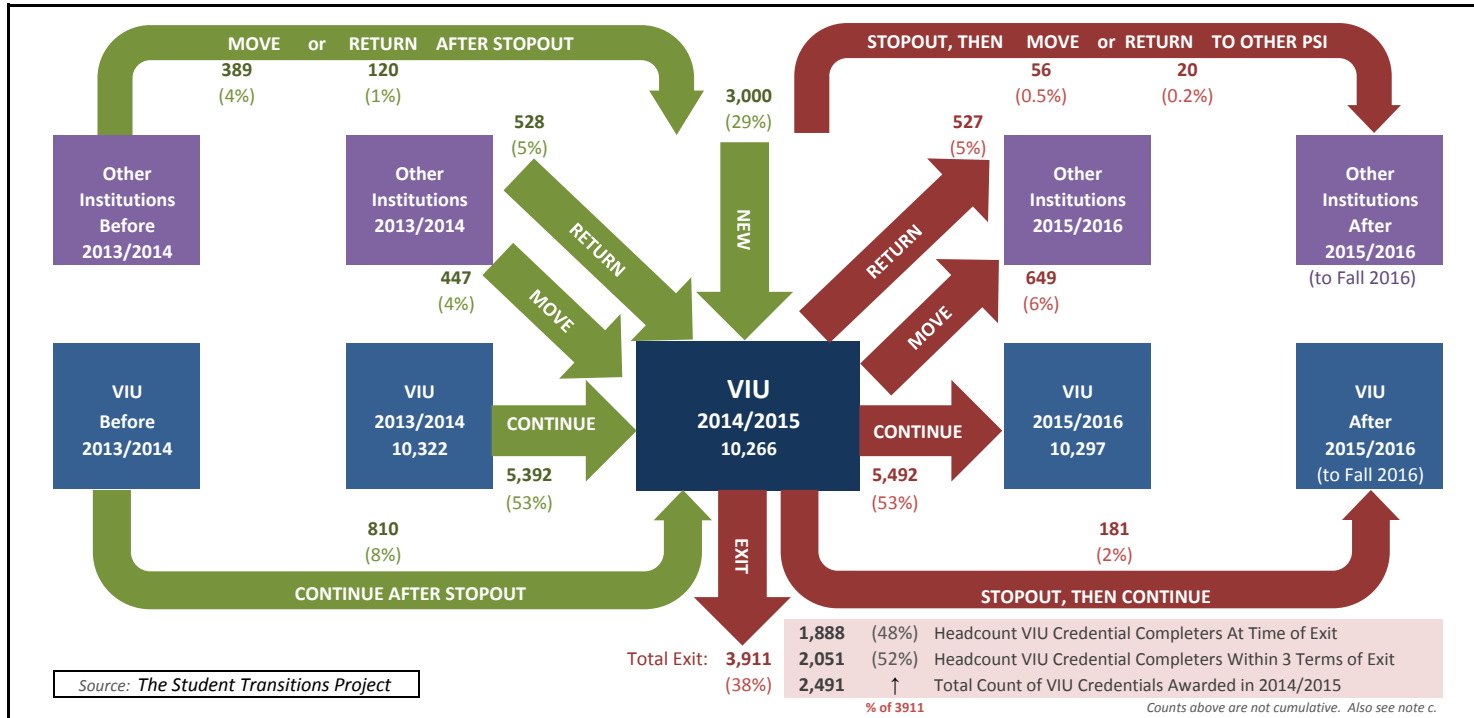
Student Pathways to University of Victoria (UVIC) in 2014/2015 and Future Student Pathways, up to Fall 2016
