Re: Sale and delivery of single-serving drinks for off-site consumption with the purchase of a meal for take-out or delivery

Previous Authorization

Food Primary (FP) and Liquor Primary (LP) licensees are authorized to package and sell single-serving mixed drinks that must contain both liquor and non-liquor ingredients (a cocktail for example) to patrons for off-site consumption with the purchase of a meal.

New Authorization

FP and LP licensees are now authorized to also package and sell single-serving drinks containing liquor for off-site consumption with the purchase of a meal for take-out/delivery. Maximum single-serving drink sizes specified in the licence terms and conditions handbook apply.

Explanation

This change expands the previous authorization with respect to single-serving mixed drinks to also include unmixed drinks (e.g., beer, cider, wine, "neat" spirits).
