How to start, maintain and search for businesses is changing in British Columbia

BC Registries and Online Services launched a phased <u>modernization initiative</u> to keep pace with technology and an increasing demand for online services. Our vision is to create a more secure, user-friendly experience and make it easier and faster to start and do business in British Columbia.

With this initiative, a new self-serve <u>BC Registry Application</u> was launched with services for: name requests, filings for cooperative associations and benefit companies and the Personal Property Registry application.

What's the next phase?

On October 24, the next phase of the initiative will be expanded to include:

- The provincial registration and maintenance of sole proprietorships and general partnerships (SP/GP) in the new <u>Business Registry</u>, replacing the <u>OneStop</u> & <u>Address Change BC</u> (ACBC) applications.
- A **new Business Search** for existing <u>BC OnLine</u> clients, providing access to business information and filings for **cooperative associations**, **benefit companies**, **sole proprietorships and general partnerships**, with other entities to be added at a later date.
 - The new Search will be available to existing BC OnLine users in the first phase and will open up to others at a later date.

Who is impacted?

- BC OnLine, OneStop and ACBC users you will register and maintain SP/GP in the new Business Registry and search for the above entities in the new Business Search.
- Users will register directly with federal, provincial and local government agencies (e.g., CRA, WorkSafeBC, etc).

How will the new Business Registry and Business Search benefit businesses in British Columbia?

- Immediate online, self-serve business registration and access to view and update information.
- SP/GP's will be able to retrieve copies of their documents, including a firm summary, free of charge.
- Ability to provide account access to other staff members or professionals (e.g. accountants and lawyers) to submit changes on a user's behalf.

Getting users ready for the late summer launch of our new services

- BC OnLine clients must be set up a <u>Premium account</u> **by September 30.** Please take action now if you do not have a new account in the BC Registry application so that you are ready for the launch of these new services; view our <u>Resources</u> for help or sign up for an <u>upcoming Info Session</u> on account creation.
- British Columbians can view the <u>user guide</u> to learn how to create an account (Basic account is recommended) which is needed to start and maintain a business. If you do not need to make updates to your business at this time, no action is required.

Getting your organization prepared for the late summer new launch

- If your website and resources contain references to "OneStop" or "Address Change BC", update them to list "the Business Registry" (https://www.bcreqistry.ca/business/auth/) in time for the launch.
