

REDIP Applicant Checklist

Interested in applying to the REDIP 2024-25 intake? Looking to meet with REDIP staff to discuss a project idea? Use the following checklist to ensure you're prepared:

• Review the REDIP Program Guide

- ✓ Familiarize yourself with the 3 funding categories (see below for a quick overview).
- ✓ Review eligible and ineligible project types.
- ✓ Review eligible costs and applicant contribution requirements.

• Understand program timelines

- ✓ Application open: July 4, 2024
- ✓ Application close: October 31, 2024, 11:59PM PST
- ✓ Funding decisions announced: March 2025
- ✓ Earliest project start date: March 2025
- ✓ Funded projects must be completed by March 2027

• Do you know if your organization already has a Business BCeID?

- ✓ If yes, ensure your password and credentials are up to date.
 - Information on BCeID credentials is located here: BCeID Instructions.
- ✓ If no, we recommend creating an account as soon as possible, as it can take several weeks to create.
- ✓ Here is a link to a BCeID frequent asked questions: <u>BCeID FAQs.</u>
- ✓ A Business BCeID is required to apply.

• Review application & budget forms

- ✓ Applications must be submitted through the online application portal.
- ✓ A webinar on the online application form will be published on the REDIP website mid-July
- ✓ Do you have any questions about cost categories or specific parts of the application form?
- ✓ Word document practice application templates are available at <u>qov.bc.ca/REDIP</u>.
- ✓ The mandatory excel budget forms are located in the online application portal.

- ✓ Can your project be divided into different phases?
- ✓ What part of the project will you seek REDIP funding for?
- ✓ How does the project connect to the economic development goals of your community?
