2010 CEEI Reports

"Every British Columbia local government now has its own Community Energy and Emissions Inventory (CEEI) Report. It has been developed to help local governments meet their Climate Action Charter commitment to measure and report on community greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions profiles, as well as to assist with meeting the requirements of the Local Government Act for OCP and RGS targets, policies and actions to reduce GHG emissions. By providing this free reporting service to local governments, their resources can instead be focused on making effective policies and actions that drive the local green economy and create jobs.

Building off the success of the baseline 2007 CEEI Reports, the CEEI Working Group is set to release the follow-up 2010 Reports which will estimate community-wide energy and emissions from a variety of sources. In addition to the reports themselves, the presentation will highlight some exciting related initiatives that build on the CEEI data. This includes the ability to download and view the CEEI data in an interactive mapping environment from DataBC, the Province's open data website. Making this data accessible to a wider audience will engage individuals, institutions, and communities and promote innovation in GHG mitigation and green economic development.

The presentation will illustrate strengths and challenges associated with using CEEI data as a baseline for developing community-wide targets, explore the level of effort involved in developing these targets, and share outcomes of the process."
