Title: "2015 Carbon Neutral Action Report"

Organization name: School District No. 48 (Sea to Sky)

Declaration statement: This Carbon Neutral Action Report for the period January 1st, 2015 to December 31st, 2015 summarizes our emissions profile, the total offsets to reach net-zero emissions, the actions we have taken in 2015 to reduce our greenhouse gas emissions and our plans to continue reducing emissions in 2016 and beyond.

Overview: In 2015, School District 48 took action to reduce GHG emissions through the following initiatives:

Unit ventilators installed in older wing of Howe Sound Senior Secondary in Squamish (phase 1 of 2): the unit ventilators allow for better controllability of heating and ventilation in classrooms, in direct response to occupancy demands. Optimized controllability results in less energy use overall.

Boiler plant optimization at Myrtle Philip Community School in Whistler (spanning 2014-2015): the school realized a reduction of 28 tCO2e as a result of the boiler optimization efforts.

Howe Sound Senior Secondary Retro-commissioning through BC Hydro Continuous Optimization Program: this school underwent an energy study to identify performance optimization opportunities. The study findings were implemented in the period of Nov 2015 to Jan 2016. The savings of this initiative will be evaluated and reported on in next year's reporting cycle.

Pellet Boiler Plant in Squamish: a new pellet boiler plant has been purchased by the school district from the 2015/16 School Enhancement Program funding, and will be installed next year, subject to obtaining funding for phase 2 of this project. The pellet boiler will be the primary heat source for Howe Sound Secondary and Squamish Elementary schools with the existing gas fired boilers to be used as backup. Estimated GHG reduction is 257.6 tCO2e annually, to be verified post installation and reported on in next year's reporting cycle.

Student engagement (2015-2016): students in a leadership program at Don Ross Middle School and Howe Sound Senior Secondary participated in BC Hydro's Energy Ambassador Program. The student leadership teams at each school developed a week-long program for promoting energy conservation awareness amongst the student body and school staff. Each team presented their projects to the school district's board of directors, and were well received. As a result of participating in the program, the students received a \$2,000 stipend that the schools used to install occupancy sensors for lighting control. Pleased with the program's success, participation has been renewed for the current school year and expanded to include participants for Whistler Senior Secondary and Pemberton Senior Secondary.

School District 48 has an **ongoing contract for energy management services** with Rede Energy Solutions Ltd. ("Rede") since May 2014. Rede is an integral part of the school district's facilities and operations team. Responsible for establishing and implementing the overall energy management strategy for the school district, Rede works with facilities leadership and staff to set energy and GHG emissions reduction targets, identify improvement opportunities, conduct building energy studies, secure grants and incentive funding, and oversee the implementation of improvement projects. Rede also participates in the student engagement initiative in facilitative and technical advisory roles. Energy savings and GHG emissions reductions are evaluated annually and new targets are set annually, as part of the strategic energy management plan to continue reducing emissions in 2016 and beyond.


