Briefly describe the top three actions taken by your organization in 2018 to reduce GHG emissions and/or improve sustainability from its operations:

Action
1. Kept thermostat at a lowered temperature in the winter – higher in summer. Discouraged the use of portable heaters.
2. Recycled cardboard, paper, glass, and all forms of plastic possible by designating one staff person to gather, sort and take into the centralized depot once per week.
3. Reduced the use of the full sized truck to minimize the FESBC carbon footprint.

Briefly describe plans your organization has for continuing to reduce your GHG emissions in future years:

<p>Executive Director has begun encouraging staff to question whether to print and, if it needs to be printed, to print double-sided in booklet format to reduce paper.</p> <p>Each staff member has been given another monitor in order to reduce the need to print off spreadsheets or other difficult to see documents.</p>
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Describe any actions your organization took during 2018 to strengthen its ability to manage the likely effects of climate change in the coming years and decades (e.g., have assessed whether increased frequency of extreme weather events and/or long term changes in climate will affect your organization’s infrastructure, its employees and/or its clients.)

<p>Undertook a full Risk Management Framework for the office in the spring of 2018 where top risks were identified and brought forward to the FESBC Board of Directors / Executive management along with mitigation strategies for each risk. These risks are to be re-assessed annually.</p>

The Organization hereby agrees that, in exchange for the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy ensuring that these offsets are retired on the Organization's behalf, the Organization will pay the associated invoice to be issued by the Ministry in an amount equal to \$25 per tonne of offsets retired on its behalf plus GST.
