C. Briefly describe the top three actions taken by your organization in 2020 to reduce GHG emissions and/or improve sustainability from its operations:

Action: As British Columbia's public broadcaster, we are committed to acting responsibly on the environment and to increase awareness of environmental and climate change issues with our viewers across the province. In 2020, Knowledge Network educated and informed British Columbians about the issues of climate change, conservation and sustainability through programs made available on-air and through our streaming services (websites and apps).

Program Highlights:

Drowning in Plastic - Plastic in our oceans is one of the greatest environmental challenges of our time, with this award-winning film at the centre of an urgent and vital debate of how to solve this global crisis.

War on Plastic - With the equivalent of a garbage truck full of plastic emptied into the world's oceans every minute of every day, this series explores where this problem is coming from, and what we can all do to solve it.

The Shadow of Gold – Explores the impact of the global mining industry as well as the lives of small-time miners in the world's poorest nations, revealing conflict, exploitation, and environmental degradation.

Planet Oil - Geologist Iain Stewart explores how our insatiable thirst for oil is changing the very planet on which we depend, and how we can make the shift to a sustainable future.

The Age of Consequences - U.S. military insiders provide insight into how climate change and the increasing scarcity of natural resources impact stability in the world's most volatile regions.

Watermark - An immersive look at how we use water and the consequences of that use, using stories from around the globe including massive floating abalone farms off China's coast, Dhaka's water-intensive leather tanneries and the barren delta where the Colorado River no longer reaches the sea.

Just Eat It - After seeing how much of our food is wasted, B.C. filmmakers eat only rescued food for six months, discovering that truckloads of perfectly edible food are destined for the landfill.



Haida Gwaii: On the Edge of the World - The breathtakingly beautiful archipelago off B.C.'s northwest coast is home to a dedicated community uniting to protect land and sea for the next generation.

KONELINE: Our Land Beautiful – Captures beauty and complexity as one of Canada's vast wildernesses in the traditional territory of the Tahltan First Nation undergoes irrevocable change.

The Life-Sized City - Explores what makes a city livable through ideas for urban renewal, visiting cities around the world that are striving to be healthy, attractive, interesting, and efficient.

Call of the Forest: The Forgotten Wisdom of Trees - Explores our profound biological and spiritual connection to trees, with their ability to capture carbon dioxide and sustain our living, breathable atmosphere for millions of years.

Bikes vs Cars - Highlights conflict in city planning between bikes, cars and a growing reliance on fossil fuels, while demonstrating how bikes can be an amazing tool for change.

Sand Wars - The worldwide construction boom fuelled by emerging economies and increasing urbanization has led to intensive sand extraction on land and in the oceans, with damaging environmental impacts.

Angry Planet - Reveals the devastating impact of global warming including the South Pacific island that is at risk of sinking below the rising sea and deadly wildfires raging across Australia.

The Polar Sea - Scientists try to understand the complex phenomenon of Arctic climate change.
