**POLICY STATEMENT**

**It is the policy of the Ministry that:**

1. A person who provides evidence of having successfully completed hunter safety training be granted the hunting credential in the Wildlife Information and Licensing Data (WILD) system, and
2. A person who provides evidence of residency be granted a residency credential in the WILD system.

**Definitions:**

“**hunting credential**” – granted to a Fish and Wildlife Profile after the user has provided acceptable documentation, as prescribed in the Hunting and Residency Credentials procedure, to prove *Indian status* or successful completion of hunter safety training.

“**residency credential**” – granted to a Fish and Wildlife Profile after the user has provided acceptable documentation, as prescribed in the Hunting and Residency Credentials procedure, to prove residency.
