D2	Deciduous: Live with defects: dead or broken top, dead limbs, fungal conks. Dying tree
D3	Deciduous: Dead: most limbs intact, some internal rot, top usually broken
D4	Deciduous: Dead: most limbs gone, top broken, extensive heartrot
D5	Deciduous: Dead: top 1/3 or more broken off, no branches, extensive heartrot
D6	Deciduous: Dead, fallen: downed trees, coarse woody debris
E1	Evergreen: live/healthy
E2	Evergreen: live/diseased or damaged
E3	Evergreen: dead/very hard wood with little external deterioration
E4	Evergreen: dead/ hard wood with some external deterioration
E5	Evergreen: dead/spongy wood with extensive external deterioration
