Recap: About the Program

The **Child Care Operating Funding (CCOF) Program** consists of three funding streams available to eligible <u>licensed</u> group, multi-age and family providers:

Base Operating Funding (CCOF Base) Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative (CCFRI) Early Childhood Educator Wage Enhancement (ECE-WE)

- Funding is application-based and accepted throughout the year.
- Funding agreements expire at the end of each fiscal (March 31).
- Facilities are listed on the **Child Care Map** and can access other programs such as **BC Maintenance**.

January 25	Apply/Renew web page updated and CCFRI and ECE-WE Funding Guidelines
January 31	My ChildCareBC Services with 2023/24 application launched on web page
February 23	2023/24 funding agreements sent to providers
March 9	Last day to sign funding agreement for providers to pre-claim
March 15	Providers can start to pre-claim for April 1
April 1	2023/24 funding term begins
April 30	Last day for providers to renew funding agreements for April 1
September 1	School age and preschool providers approved for CCFRI begin reducing fees



Expanding the CCFRI to More Families

Starting September 1, 2023, families will save up to the following amounts:



Pro-rated amounts apply for part-time care.

Fees will not be reduced below \$200/month for full-time care (\$140/month for enrolment of 4 hours or less per day, including Preschool)



Calculating Parent Fees

Example:	Original child care fees	Total fee reduction after increase	Total fees after reduction
Group provider charging fees for school aged children	\$400	- \$115	\$285/month
Family provider charging fees for school aged children	\$400	- \$145	\$255/month



Calculating Parent Fees

Example:	Original child care fees	Total fee reduction after increase	Total fees after reduction
Group provider charging fees for school aged children	\$300	- \$100	\$200/month
Family provider charging fees for school aged children	\$325	- \$125	\$200/month



CCFRI Provider Payment: Preschool & Grade 1 to Age 12

Provider Type	Rate Category	Current Payment (CCOF Base Funding only)	Additional Support (CCFRI Provider Payment)	New Total Payments (Starting Sept 1, 2023)
Group & Multi-Age	Preschool (Up to 4 Hours/Day)	\$27.40	\$12.60	\$40.00
	Grade 1 to Age 12 (Over 4 Hours/Day)	\$56.00	\$26.00	\$82.00
Family	Grade 1 to Age 12 (Over 4 Hours/Day)	\$29.20	\$20.60	\$49.80
In-Home Multi-Age	Grade 1 to Age 12 (Over 4 Hours/Day)	\$35.00	\$21.80	\$56.80

*Per child, based on a 20-day month.



CCFRI Affordability Benchmarks

Affordability Benchmarks were introduced April 2021 to:

- ✓ Improve equitability for child care providers applying for the CCFRI
- ✓ Ensure new facilities accessing provincial funding charge fees in line with most similar facilities in their region
- ✓ Help make child care more affordable for families

What's changing for April 2023?

- Affordability Benchmark is increasing from the previous 70th percentile to:
 - 80th percentile for under 36 months care
 - 75th percentile for 3 years to Kindergarten
- Adjusted in response to the Ministry's continued monitoring of this policy's impacts and feedback received from stakeholders. Limited exceptions apply.



2023/24 ECE Wage Enhancement Funding Guidelines

- As of September 1, 2023, facilities offering care to children in preschool and/or school aged children (Grade 1 to age 12+) must be enrolled in the CCFRI in order to be eligible for the ECE-WE.
- As these categories will become eligible for the CCFRI on September 1, 2023, the requirement will apply for these care types, just as it does for other CCFRI-eligible programs.
- Facilities not approved to participate in the CCFRI as of September 1, 2023 will no longer be eligible to participate in the ECE-WE.



2023/24 Funding Agreement Updates

Communicating with parents/public:

- ✓ Section 4.1
 - (b) Provide the parents of any newly enrolled child in writing, details around your approved participation in CCFRI.
 - (c) You must advise parents of enrolled children of any relevant information to this Agreement in the form and frequency directed by us in writing.

Sharing investigation information with parents/public:

- ✓ Section 10.5
 - The status of, or results of any investigation by the Ministry into your compliance decreasing Parent Fees and/or distributing ECE Wage Enhancement Funding in accordance with this Agreement can be released to the public.



2023/24 CCFRI Assessment

Facility Closures

- Facilities may charge full monthly parent fees for closures of up to 2 consecutive weeks per month, or 4 weeks per year
- Limited exceptions

Initial Fees (for new Facilities)

- Fees must be at or below the Affordability Benchmark
- Limited exceptions, including for Preschool/Grade 1 to 12 Years Fees until Sep 2023/Mar 2024

Parent Fee Increases

- Annual Fee Increase Limit based on 3% of the regional median fee
- Limited exceptions, up to a maximum based on 10% of the median fee



Parent Fee Increase

A parent fee increase is an increase to the daily/monthly fee you charge a parent for their child to occupy a space at your facility.

A parent fee increase includes:

- A reduction of hours of operation or services previously included in the parent fee, and the imposition of added fees for these same hours or services; and
- Imposing a new administrative fee or increasing an administrative fee for some or all children enrolled in a CCFRI-Eligible Care Category.



What Fees to Report on Your Program Confirmation Form

Report your **highest full-time daily/monthly parent fee** on your Program Confirmation Form, exclusive of optional fees.

The full-time daily/monthly fee is used to determine eligibility for CCFRI:

- **For new providers**, to assess whether parent fees are set at or below their regional 2023-24 Affordability Benchmark.
- **For existing providers**, to assess whether any planned fee increase is at or below the 2023-24 Annual Fee Increase Limit for the facility's region.

The full-time daily/monthly fee also used to determine the CCFRI amount.

 If the maximum Parent Fee Reduction reduces the parent fee to less than \$200 per month (\$10/day), the CCFRI amount will be reduced so parent fees are at least \$200 per month – resulting in a lower fee reduction amount.



What if I Only Offer Part-Time Care?

- The full-time daily/monthly fee is used to determine the CCFRI amount.
- To ensure you receive the maximum fee reduction amount:
 - If you only offer care for 4 hours or less each day, calculate the parent fee you would charge for more than 4 hours of care.
 - If you only offer care for 4 days or fewer per week, **report your daily rate**.
- Reporting a part-day or part-time rate may lower the amount of CCFRI parents are eligible to receive.



Streamlined Process to Request More Information

- The ministry may request additional information and/or documentation to assess applications for facilities with parent fee increases under the Parent Fee Increase Exceptions Policy.
- With My ChildCareBC Services, the process is embedded into the Program Confirmation Form for renewing providers.
 - Providers with proposed fee increases above the Fee Increase Limit will be required to provide more information and/or documentation automatically when completing their Program Confirmation Form.
 - No additional information is required for providers with no fee increase and those with fee increases below the Fee Increase Limit.



My ChildCareBC Services

- My ChildCareBC Services (MyCCBC) is a new cloud-based platform available on January 31 for CCOF, CCFRI and/or ECE-WE funding.
- The platform was developed to streamline the renewal process for a more user-friendly experience.
- The platform includes:
 - the online application form to apply for, or renew funding
 - a secure way to receive communications from the program
 - reminders and notifications to help keep track of deadlines
 - indicators to track the status of applications
- Increased functions scheduled in future versions.
