This newsletter is meant to share information and support the ministry's commitment to ongoing consultation and collaboration with Indigenous Peoples, partners and governments to develop legislation and services consistent with the provincial *Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act* as well as the *UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples*.

We will listen to the children, youth and families we serve, knowing their voices and experiences are central to the creation of services that truly meet their needs.

#### **Youth Transitions Improved Supports**

The ministry continues to develop new and improved supports for youth and young adults transitioning to adulthood from care, up to the age of 27.

On April 3, 2023, changes to supports were announced including:

- Improved dental and optical benefits
- Increased flexibility to Temporary Housing and Temporary Support agreements
- Increased duration for Agreements with Young Adults program from 48 to 84 months
- Expanded eligibility to the Provincial Tuition Waiver program

#### Life-skills, Training and Cultural Connections

New funding will be available in summer 2023 to support those on the Agreement with Young Adults program to participate in life-skills, training, and/or cultural connections activities.

Last month, the ministry invited First Nations families and communities to participate in a virtual gathering on May 10 to begin deeper engagement to build a system that better serves all children and youth with support needs based on their unique needs, and to meet the standards of the *Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act*. The session is open to all interested First Nations.

### **Proposed Youth Navigator Policy:**

- As part of the ministry's improved services for youth transitions, the navigator role has been created
- A proposed policy has been developed to guide navigators supporting eligible youth through transition to adulthood, including youth from their 14th year into their 19th year
