### **Youth Transitions Regulations**

The ministry continues to develop new and improved supports for youth and young adults transitioning to adulthood from care, up to the age of 27. This program is being implemented over three years. It started in 2022 and will continue through 2024.

We are now preparing to develop the regulations required to enable some of these young adult services in consultation and cooperation with First Nation, Métis, and Inuit partners. Contact sam.dauch@gov.bc.ca to get involved.

Introducing SAJE: Youth with lived experience with the government care system, including Indigenous youth, helped develop the new name of this program — Strengthening Abilities and Journeys of Empowerment (SAJE).

On May 10 the ministry commenced engagement with First Nations Rights and Titleholders to begin co-developing a Children and Youth with Support Needs system that better serves all children and youth, based on their unique needs, and upholds the *Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act*. The next sessions will be held virtually via Zoom on June 12 and 27. Contact mcf.cysnengage@gov.bc.ca to participate.

We also invite Métis, urban Indigenous and Inuit Peoples and others to participate in additional engagements, so we can gain input on the service approach based on the unique needs and priorities of various communities.
