Discussion Paper Lays Groundwork for Conversations on Jurisdiction Funding Model

You will soon receive a formal letter of invitation to participate in the co-development of a funding model for child and family services jurisdiction. The discussion paper, "Building a Funding Model to Support First Nations Jurisdiction over Child and Family Services in B.C.", is intended to facilitate discussion and co-development of the model.

In addition, we are planning engagement sessions from September through November 2023. This process will ultimately lead to a BC-specific funding model to support the exercise of First Nations jurisdiction over child and family services.

Legislative Amendments to the Child, Family and Community Service Act (CFCSA)

Engagement is underway on legislative amendments to the CFCSA to be introduced in spring 2024. These amendments will address the need for procedural safeguards respecting the powers of both a CFCSA director and an Indigenous authority to compel information from public bodies to deliver child and family services.

The ministry is also proposing changes to the CFCSA to resolve a small number of immediate issues impacting Indigenous jurisdiction over child and family services. Initial policy engagement has taken place, and the legislative development phase will occur in September. We will notify you prior to engagements on legislative drafting.
