



2025 Quick Guide to Drought Resources

Prolonged dry weather can lead to water shortages, crop damage, and other challenges. The following resources can help producers prepare for and adapt to drought conditions.

DROUGHT IN AGRICULTURE WEBPAGE

The Ministry of Agriculture and Food's <u>Drought in Agriculture</u> webpage is a hub for B.C.'s agricultural water resources. NEW BC AgriWeather and Evapotranspiration Calculator

Access real-time weather data from over 230 stations across B.C. and use the Evapotranspiration (ET) calculator to estimate irrigation needs and optimize water management.



Agricultural Irrigation Scheduling Calculator

Optimize water use and improve crop and soil health by generating customized, five-day irrigation schedules using real-time data from BC AgriWeather and weather forecasts.



B.C. Irrigation Water Use Calculator

Track actual irrigation water use without a flow meter by inputting system run times or pump energy data, generating reports for better water management and drought planning.



B.C. Agriculture Water Calculator

Estimate irrigation and livestock water needs based on location, climate, soils, crop/livestock type, and irrigation system. *NEW* Dugout Calculator to help producers plan water storage.

FUNDING PROGRAMS - WATER

The <u>Agriculture Water Infrastructure Program</u> provides cost-share funding for water infrastructure investments to producers, conservation groups, water purveyors, and Indigenous communities.

The <u>Beneficial Management Practices</u> program offers funding for onfarm water infrastructure planning and implementation (e.g., irrigation systems, water storage systems). With water-related intakes expected to reopen in 2026, position yourself well for upcoming funding opportunities by completing your free and confidential <u>Environmental Farm Plan</u>.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR AGRICULTURAL PRODUCERS

The Ministry of Agriculture and Food's Business Risk Management Branch administers a suite of insurance and income stability programs that are designed to work together to enable B.C.'s agricultural producers to manage business risks that are beyond their control (production losses, severe market volatility, extreme weather events or disasters). For example:

- <u>Production Insurance (crop insurance)</u>: Affordable insurance program that supports agricultural producers to manage the risk of crop losses caused by weather perils.
- <u>AgriStability</u>: Helps stabilize farm income by managing the risk of large income declines.

CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION PROGRAM

The <u>Climate Change Adaptation Program</u> operated from 2008 to 2023 and developed several resources to support producers in understanding their water use and increasing irrigation efficiencies. B.C. DROUGHT INFORMATION FROM OTHER MINISTRIES

The <u>B.C. Drought Preparation and Response</u> webpage provides information on drought preparedness, water conservation, and strategies to help individuals, farmers, and communities manage water use.

Provincial drought levels are posted on the <u>B.C. Drought Information Portal</u>, which is updated regularly during the drought season. The portal also contains information on watershed conditions and other information related to drought monitoring.
