


Salmonella Dublin Investigation and Management Program (SDIMP)

BULK MILK TESTING REPORT

JANUARY 2025

In March 2024 the BC Ministry of Agriculture and Food began a new Salmonella Dublin surveillance program. This involves testing of bulk tank milk (BTM) samples from farms across the province for S. Dublin antibodies. As part of this new program, we aim to test participating farms quarterly from March 2024—March 2028.

There is only a \sim 50% probability that an infected farm will be positive on a single test. Our ability to detect positive farms increases when farms are tested four times over the course of a calendar year. Specifically, there is a 95% probability that an infected farm will test positive on one or more of these four tests. For this reason, negative tests results ought to be interpreted cautiously until a farm has four negative test results in a row.



December 2024 Results Summary

A total of 413 farms were tested in December 2024. Among these farms, 115 (28%) were positive. A farm was considered positive if it had a positive BTM test within the previous 12 months (i.e., October 2023—September 2024). A **positive** test indicates the presence of antibodies against S. Dublin in BTM and the presence of antibodies in BTM suggests cows on the farm are likely infected with S.

Dublin. A positive test **does not** mean there is bacteria in the milk and pasteurization ensures milk is safe for consumption.
