## Sector Snapshot 2021: B.C. Seafood

B.C.'s seafood sector comprises primary production from wild commercial fishing and aquaculture. Primary seafood production does not include post-vessel or post-farm processing.


- > B.C. consistently ranks as the 4<sup>th</sup> largest farmed Atlantic salmon producer in the world.
- ➤ B.C. led the nation in sales of farmed salmon, crabs (non-queen), wild clams, wild salmon, hake, wild sablefish, rockfish, tuna, farmed clams, sea cucumbers, lingcod, wild sea urchins, and Pacific cod.





- ➤ Total sales of primary seafood production in B.C. were \$1.166 billion in landed and farm gate value an increase of 14.9% from 2020.
- The wild commercial fishery harvest was 147,826 tonnes and generated a landed value of \$409.7 million. While the harvest was down by 16.4% from 2020, the landed value was up by 21.5%.
- Approximately 2,292 vessels harvested in B.C. waters in 2021, down 0.8% from the previous year.
- In 2021, 843 aquaculture operations were licensed to produce fish, invertebrates, and algae (14.7% increase).
- ➤ The aquaculture harvest of 108,662 tonnes was up 8.5% from the previous year, while farm gate value increased by 11.6% to \$755.9 million.
- ➤ Total GDP for primary seafood was \$300.9 million and accounted for 0.12% of B.C.'s total GDP¹.
- Top 10 seafood commodities of sales were farmed Atlantic salmon, crabs, halibut, wild geoducks, farmed Pacific salmon, prawns, wild sablefish, farmed oysters, wild salmon, and tuna, in decreasing order.

## SEAFOOD INTERNATIONAL EXPORTS

- Exported seafood products include both primary seafood production and post-vessel and post-farm processed seafood products.
- In 2021, B.C. exported \$1.383 billion in seafood products to 61 markets, an increase of 5.6% from 2020.
- Top five seafood export markets: USA (67.4%); China (16.1%); Japan (5.3%); Hong Kong (2.8%); and Ukraine (2.6%)
- ➤ Of the top 10 export markets, the fastest growing in YOY percentage growth in 2021 were Romania (42.5%), Ukraine (14.2%), USA (10.9%), Hong Kong and UK (both at 7.4%).
- ➤ Top five seafood exports: \$519 million (+37.6%) in farmed Atlantic salmon, \$255 million (+18.5%) in crabs, \$123 million (+8.9%) in wild salmon, \$73 million (+5.3%) in hake, and \$61 million (+4.4%) in geoduck clams.
