**Small Fuel Containers <230 L** Includes drums, pails and canisters typically used to transport, store, and dispense small quantities of fuel, oil, solvents, and antifreeze.

**Small Mobile (Truck Box) Tanks ≤450L Ancillary** tank located in the box of a pickup truck used to transport, store, and dispense fuel

**Large Mobile Tanks >450 L to ≤3000L** Ancillary tank typically located in the box of a pickup truck used to transport, store, and dispense fuel

**Highway Tanks & TC Portable Tanks, generally >3000L** Used to transport fuel. Sometimes used to store and dispense fuel.

**Large Stationary Skid Tanks >3000L** Used to store and dispense fuel, rarely used to transport fuel
