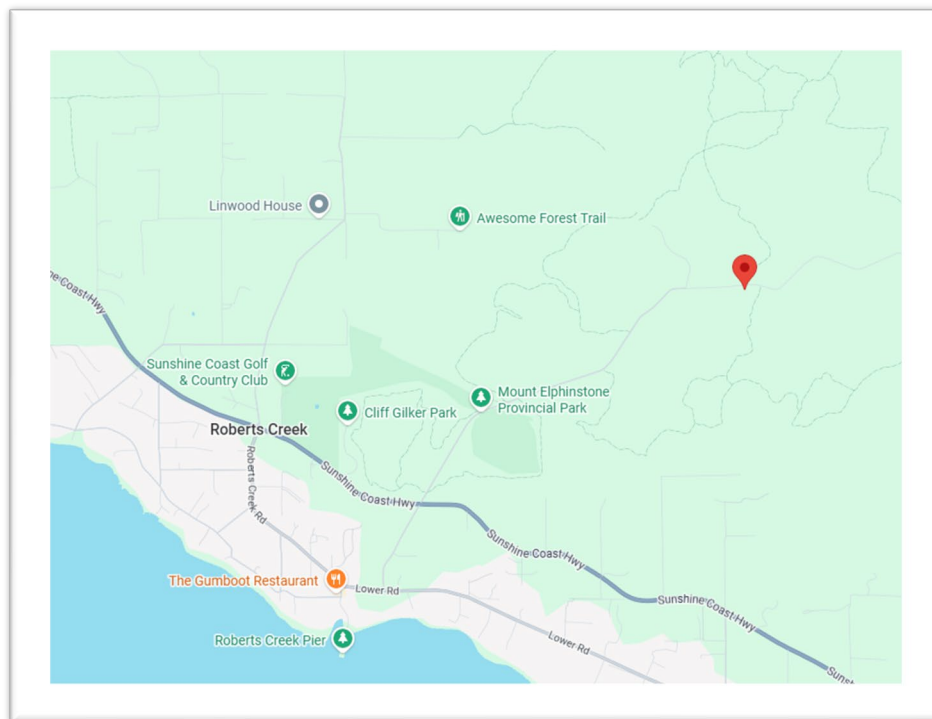


Road Construction Notice: B&K Forest Service Road

June 2, 2026

B&K Forest Service Road

The B&K (Sechelt–Roberts) Forest Service Road (FSR) is located northeast of Mount Elphinstone Provincial Park. This dirt and gravel road is popular with outdoor enthusiasts seeking access to the Mount Elphinstone area. The proposed road construction is adjacent to Timber Sale Licence (TSL) A94817 ([Mount Elphinstone TSL A94817 Factsheet](#)) and will involve approximately 4.2 km of new FSR. The project is intended to shift industrial traffic away from sections of the existing FSR that are heavily used by the public, improving long-term safety and access for recreational users.



Road Construction Details

- Under the guidance of a professional hydrologist, BCTS conducted water quality monitoring on Roberts Creek for approximately one year and will continue monitoring throughout road construction.
 - All recommendations from the professional hydrology reports were incorporated into the road design.

- All drainage structures were designed using terrain and hydrology assessments that account for climate change and long-term planning.
- Bridge design and installation will be overseen by a professional engineer and an environmental monitor, who conducts terrain and hydrology assessments to mitigate any soil or terrain disturbance.
- Road construction designs incorporate enhanced overland construction techniques to minimize ground water interception.
- Modern road building practices and intensive water quality monitoring and oversight will ensure consistency with the development plan.
- Community engagement on this road construction project occurred between 2022 and 2026 and included community meetings, government to government meetings and information sharing through several annual operating plans (4) and Forest Operations Maps (3).

About BC Timber Sales

- BC Timber Sales (BCTS) was established in 2003 to provide benchmark costs and prices from the harvest of Crown/public timber in British Columbia.
- Data from BCTS operations is used to help determine the market value of timber harvested from public land and ensures British Columbians receive fair value from their timber resources.
- BCTS manages about 20% of the provincial allowable annual cut through 12 business areas operating in 33 communities.
