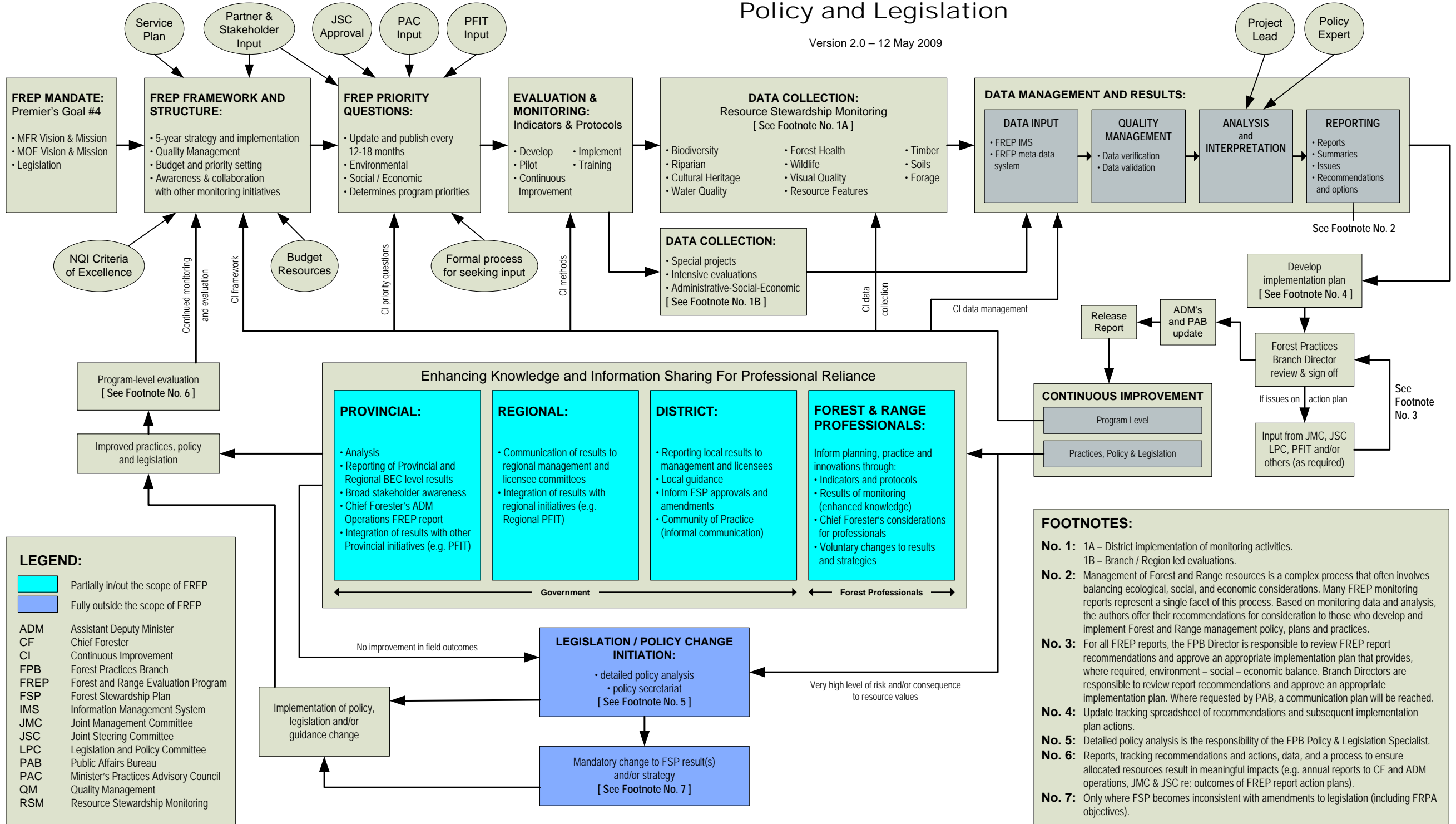

- No. 2:** Management of Forest and Range resources is a complex process that often involves balancing ecological, social, and economic considerations. Many FREP monitoring reports represent a single facet of this process. Based on monitoring data and analysis, the authors offer their recommendations for consideration to those who develop and implement Forest and Range management policy, plans and practices.
- No. 3:** For all FREP reports, the FPB Director is responsible to review FREP report recommendations and approve an appropriate implementation plan that provides, where required, environment – social – economic balance. Branch Directors are responsible to review report recommendations and approve an appropriate implementation plan. Where requested by PAB, a communication plan will be reached.
- No. 4:** Update tracking spreadsheet of recommendations and subsequent implementation plan actions.
- No. 5:** Detailed policy analysis is the responsibility of the FPB Policy & Legislation Specialist.
- No. 6:** Reports, tracking recommendations and actions, data, and a process to ensure allocated resources result in meaningful impacts (e.g. annual reports to CF and ADM operations, JMC & JSC re: outcomes of FREP report action plans).
- No. 7:** Only where FSP becomes inconsistent with amendments to legislation (including FRPA objectives).
