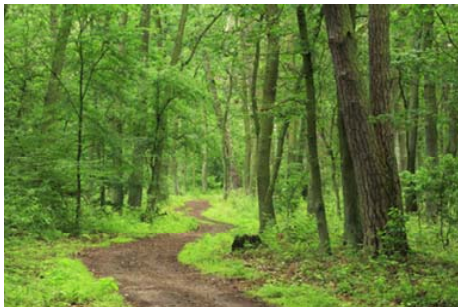

To acquire the appropriate legal interest in land to facilitate wood fibre flow / operational investment throughout the Province

What do we do?

The Forest Land Acquisition Group members are the experts when it comes to determining the status of a Forest Service Road and acquiring proper legal access across private lands to provide private or public access to BC's natural resources. We also acquire suitable legal interests in land to support investments in capital infrastructure by BC Wildfire Service, forest operations and other natural resource sectors



How?

FLAG obtains legal access by way of partial takings. That can include;

- Dedication of Crown Corridors
- Statutory Right of Ways
- Leases

Who does this benefit?
