STEPS TO AWARDING A SALVAGE SALE

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<p>STEP 1: <u>APPLICANT LOCATES TIMBER</u> Timber must be 'imperilled': Volume affected should be less than maximum allowable to qualify for a Forestry Licence to Cut</p> <p>Proposed salvage is less likely to proceed in the following situations:</p> <p>Proposed salvage will not proceed in the following areas:</p>	<p>Dead and/or downed timber; damaged trees that will die within one year; trees infested with insects that will die within one year; and logging residue.</p> <p>Each patch of salvage must be less than 2000 m³ of affected timber and less than 3 ha in size.</p> <p>- Riparian areas along large (or fishbearing) creeks, lakes or wetlands. - Adjacent to plantations where significant damage may occur to regeneration. - Salvage involving Clearcuts >3 ha - cash sale applications using equipment other than chainsaw and pickup.</p> <p>- Parks, Private Land, area-based tenures. - Within approved or proposed harvesting plan areas under other tenures: Cutting Permits, Timber Sales, Licenses to Cut, etc.</p>
<p>STEP 2: <u>APPLICANT COMPLETES APPLICATION</u> Page 1: Application Information Page 2: Harvesting Area Map</p>	<p>Proposals are accepted on a first come first served basis. If more than one proposal is received on the same area, the earliest date and time received has first preference. Map all significant features such as logged areas, streams and wetlands, power lines, road names, km markers, etc. If in an operational chart area, contact licensee to receive written support of the salvage (if needed, request contact information from salvage co-ordinator).</p>
<p>STEP 3: <u>PRE-APPLICATION REVIEW</u></p>	<p>Salvage Co-ordinator will perform a cursory review of the proposal and will advise the applicant by mail whether there are significant issues and whether First Nations consultation is required.</p>
<p>STEP 4: <u>FIELD INSPECTION</u> Applicant hires a Registered Professional Forester (R.P.F.) to conduct a field review and prepare the Professional Salvage Application (P.S.A.) package</p>	<p>Contracted R.P.F. and Applicant walk the area under proposal and review the site factors and logistics of salvage. Contracted R.P.F. and/or Salvage Co-ordinator ensures that: the timber meets the definition of imperilled (or qualifies for special forest products), the volume meets Forestry Licence to Cut criteria, that the proposal is consistent with district policies, that critical site factors will not be compromised, that required field marking and layout is completed and prepares required documents</p>
<p>STEP 5: <u>SALVAGE PLAN</u> Following the FIELD INSPECTION the Contracted R.P.F. will draft and refer a Salvage Plan.</p>	<p>Legislation requires that harvesting on crown land must be followed up with reforestation, as a result a reforestation charge of between \$2 and \$5 /m³ may be applied to the salvage permit.</p> <p>The proposed Salvage Plan is referred to First Nations and affected stakeholders. If the proposed salvage is within a Major Licensee Forest License or Tree Farm License area, the Major Licensee may elect to harvest the area themselves.</p>
<p>STEP 6: <u>FORESTRY TO LICENCE TO CUT (FLTC) PREPARATION</u> If the Salvage Plan is approved the Salvage Co-ordinator will draft a FLTC for the Applicant.</p>	<p>An appraisal of the timber is done and a stumpage rate and security deposit amount are determined. The FLTC is generated electronically and the document and maps are done.</p>
<p>STEP 7: <u>PRE-WORK</u></p>	<p>Once the FLTC Document is prepared the Applicant and contracted R.P.F. meet for a pre-work. The terms and conditions of the FLTC Document are reviewed. The Applicant is responsible to obtain and/or submit the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Deposit - Completed Scale Site Designation; and - Road Maintenance Agreement with the Permit Holder on all Forest Service Roads that the Applicant proposes hauling over. <p>The Applicant signs the FLTC Document and Harvest Guide and the documents are forwarded to the District Manager for approval.</p>
<p>STEP 8: <u>FLTC APPROVAL</u></p>	<p>The District Manager will review and if all is in order, sign the FLTC document.</p>

* Applicant must have a copy of the approved licence document prior to commencing harvesting operations.*
