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1.0 Objectives

This review strategy is an overview of the process that Canadian Forest Products Ltd. will follow to ensure public awareness and involvement during the development of Management Plan 9 for TFL 30.

The public involvement process has two basic objectives:

- Promote public awareness of the management plan process and resource management strategies within TFL 30.
- Provide an opportunity for input from persons interested in, or affected by, management plan strategies or resource development within TFL 30.

2.0 Overview of Reviewing Groups and Organizations

Opportunities for review and comment will be provided, but not restricted to, the following groups:

- Resource agency staff, federal and provincial
- Licenced tenure holders within TFL 30
- First Nations
- Special interest groups and other resource users
- Local governments
- Provincial members of parliament covering TFL 30
- General public within the Prince George area
- Prince George LRMP implementation team

3.0 Notification

3.1 Newspaper Advertisements

The purpose of a newspaper advertisement is to promote awareness of the opportunity to provide comment / involvement during the management planning process to a large general audience. The target audience area is the city of Prince George and its' surrounding rural communities. Advertisements will be run twice during the development of Management Plan 9. Each advertisement period will consist of advertisements being posted three times per week for a period of two consecutive weeks, twice during weekdays and once on the weekend.

[The term of the review period for the Draft Management Plan was determined to be inadequate. In agreement with Staff at the Ministry of Forests Regional Office, Canfor initiated a second review and comment period with an advertisement on May 3. This was done to meet the full requirements of Section 2.13 of Canfor's Licence Agreement.]

3.2 Notification Letters

In conjunction with the newspaper advertisement, notification letters will be sent to persons and/or organizations that have previously expressed interest in, or are likely to be impacted by resource development and management decisions for TFL 30. The notification letters will provide known interested parties with a direct opportunity to participate in resource decisions throughout the management plan process. Any person / organization commenting as a result of the newspaper advertisement will be asked if they want to be added to the Key Contact List for management planning on TFL 30.

3.3 Agency Referral

During the development of Management Plan # 9, components such as the timber supply analysis information package, timber supply analysis, twenty year plan, and the draft management plan will be referred to various staff members of applicable government agencies for review and comment. The latest version of the "Tree Farm Licence Management Plan Guidelines" will be used as a guide for referral to agency staff.

The following government agencies are usually involved in review and comment of management plan components: The Ministry of Forests, Regional, District and Branch levels; The Ministry of Environment Lands and Parks; and Fisheries and Oceans Canada. The Ministry of Small Business Tourism and Culture may also be involved.

4.0 Public Involvement Opportunities

4.1 Public Review and Comment Periods

Management Plan 8 - At least one week after the last newspaper advertisement, and for at least one month, Canfor will make all necessary information available for review and comment. All information will be available for review at the Canfor Administration Centre, Prince George, during regular business hours. A Canfor staff member will be available for assistance and discussion of resource management concerns.

Draft Management Plan 9 - The review and comment period for the Draft Management Plan will be held from February 23 to March 30, 2001.

[The term of this review and comment period was determined to be inadequate. In agreement with Staff at the Ministry of Forests Regional Office, Canfor initiated a second review and comment period which was held from May 3, 2001 to July 2, 2001. This was done to meet the full requirements of Section 2.13 of Canfor's Licence Agreement.]

4.2 Invitation for Review and Comment Meeting

All parties receiving a notification letter will be invited to meet with us to review and comment on the Management Plan. A Canfor staff member will be available to explain / discuss the management planning process and resource development issues on TFL 30.

4.3 Appointments Outside of Regular Business Hours

All advertisements and notification letters will specify that if an interested party is not available for review and comment during regular business hours, then upon request a Canfor staff member will arrange a meeting at a mutually acceptable time and place.

4.4 Open Houses

During the development of management plan 9, Canfor will take advantage of any trade shows or public viewing opportunities to display all completed information related to the management plan or resource development on TFL 30.

4.5 Agency Involvement

Since the Fall of 1998, agency staff members have been actively involved in a scenario planning project on TFL 30 that will analyze the implications of various resource management options on TFL 30. This project was complete in June of 1999 and has helped Canfor staff create realistic and achievable resource management expectations on TFL 30.

Resource agency staff will be involved in resource analysis throughout the duration of Management Plan # 9.

5.0 Collection of Comments and Consideration

Canfor will record all comments, written or oral, from any party responding to either the advertisement or the notification letter. To facilitate a more thorough review, Canfor will try to provide any maps or supporting information to interested parties. Canfor will give full consideration to any comment / concern received, and wherever possible will try to accommodate the concerns expressed. We will respond, in writing, to all comments received explaining how the concerns are, or are not addressed.

Throughout the duration of Management Plan 9, Canfor staff will work closely with government agencies to work-through complex resource trade-off decisions and come to a mutually acceptable outcome. All concerns and comments will be documented and given full consideration during the development of Management Plan 9.

6.0 Public Involvement Summary Report

Within one month after the end of each public review period, a Public Involvement Summary Report will be prepared and submitted to the Regional Manager.

[Reports # 1 was completed to document comments gathered as a result of the advertisement for MP 8. Report # 1 was submitted to the Regional Manager within one month after the closure of the review period.]

[Report # 2 contains the results of the information gathering phase of the Recreation Features Inventory; and the results of the review and comment period for the Draft Management Plan. As discussed above, the initial review and comment period was not inadequate and a second period was necessary. As agreed upon with the Ministry of Forests, Report # 2 is submitted within one month of the closure of the second review and comment period for the Draft Management Plan and includes the results of both the initial and second periods.]

Northwood Inc. is also in the beginning phases of management plan number 9, including preliminary resource analysis and review strategy.

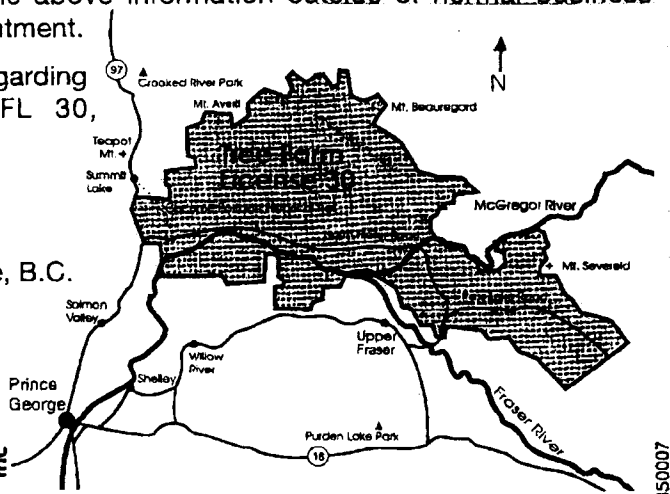





This letter is in response to your comments provided to us on March 28, 2001 regarding Draft Management Plan 9 for TFL 30. Our review and comment period has concluded and we are now ready to submit the Proposed Management Plan to the Ministry of Forests for approval.

To accommodate your concern about the high-use backcountry skiing area east of the Woodall Recreation Emphasis Area (old burn and steep slopes facing Pass Lake) we have included a paragraph in the text (Section 6.5.3 - Backcountry Recreation) that commits Canfor to communicating information on activities in the Woodall / Bearpaw area. We are unable to expand the size of the Woodall Recreation Emphasis Area as requested because this would affect the definition of the Timber Harvesting Land Base (THLB). The existing Woodall REA has been delineated to incorporate the majority of the areas identified as high value for outdoor recreation. We feel that the size of the existing Woodall REA along with the other REA's designated on TFL 30 adequately manages and conserves the outdoor recreation resource (non-roaded). The inclusion of your groups in our communication process will add further value to the protection of this resource as specific activities can be discussed at the site level.


This letter is in response to your comments provided to us on April 6, 2001 regarding Draft Management Plan 9 for TFL 30. Our review and comment period has concluded and we are now ready to submit the Proposed Management Plan to the Ministry of Forests for approval.

The following points provide answers to your questions:

1. Lower level plans such as Forest Development Plans (FDP's) must be consistent with the Management Plan. The Prescribing Forester (RPF who signs and seals the FDP) must thoroughly review the MP and all other higher level direction to ensure it is consistent. The District Manager (Statutory Decision Maker) must then review and approve the FDP provided it adequately manages for forest resources, which includes taking into account for Higher-Level Plans. The Sustainable Forest Management Plan is an internal Canfor document and will have clear measurable objectives that are established in concert with a Public Advisory Group. This Plan is certified by a Registrar of the Canadian Standards Association and must also be consistent with Higher-Level Plans.
2. Appendix 2 was still under development at the time of your review. It is now available. If you would like to review this document please contact either Kerry Deschamps or myself to make suitable arrangements.
3. Bark beetles as well as a host of other health issues affect old-growth forests. We will manage to meet the old growth targets as well as minimizing losses to bark beetles through an aggressive monitoring and control strategy that strives to maintain beetle populations at endemic levels. Specific strategies / tactics for control are detailed in the Forest Development Plan.
4. We consider all "comments" received as "meaningful" comment. We are committed to providing a clear and accountable Public Involvement strategy throughout all phases of our planning.

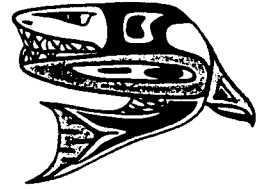

1.0 INTRODUCTION

This report is submitted to the Regional Manager, Prince George Forest Region, as part of the requirements of the Review Strategy for Management Plan 9 for Tree Farm Licence 30, approved July 6, 1999.

The purpose of the Public Involvement Summary Report is:

- To report-out on the achievements of Northwood in meeting the commitments in the Review Strategy and;
- To summarize the steps taken to solicit public involvement and how individuals or organizations were involved in the Management Plan process to date.

2.0 SOLICITATION OF PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

To date, two processes have been initiated to solicit public involvement:

- Solicitation of comment on Management Plan 8 and;
- Solicitation of public comment as part of the Recreation Features Inventory.

As part of the Review Strategy, Management Plan 8 has been advertised in the Prince George citizen to solicit public comment regarding Northwood's performance associated with the current management plan. A total of six issues were run between the dates of May 17 to 28, 1999, four of which were run on weekdays and two on the weekends. Notification Letters were sent to all individuals identified on the Key Contact List attached to the Review Strategy. The public review and comment for this process began one week after the last advertisement (June 5, 1999) and was in effect for a one-month period, ending on July 2, 1999.

As part of the Recreation Features Inventory, Notification Letters were sent to all known recreational user groups known to operate within the Prince George area. This process is necessary to collect comments from recreational users regarding new areas of interest or new activities occurring within TFL 30. These new features or activities are then added to the inventory files and thus integrated into the management plan process. The Recreation Features Inventory began in May of 1999 and will be completed by September 1999.

A total of 45 Notification Letters were sent as result of both solicitation processes.

3.0 AGENCY INVOLVEMENT

Since September of 1999, three government agencies: the Ministry of Forest; the Ministry of Environment, Lands and Parks; and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada have been actively involved in a scenario planning project to analyze a variety of management scenarios on TFL 30. This project is now completed and has provided Northwood and government agency staff with a thorough understanding of resource management relationships on TFL 30.

4.0 PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT SUMMARY

4.1 Management Plan 8: Solicitation of Public Comment

Northwood has received a total of three responses regarding the solicitation of public comment for Management Plan 8 performance. All responses were as a result of the Notification Letters.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this Public Involvement Summary Report is:

- To summarize all public involvement activities;
- To document all comments received and;
- To present Canfor's proposed management actions to accommodate public comment, if any.

2.0 PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT ACTIVITIES

To date 3 processes have been initiated to solicit public involvement at the management plan level:

- 1) Solicitation of comment on Management Plan 8 (See Report # 1).
- 2) Solicitation of public comment as part of the Recreation Features Inventory.
- 3) Solicitation of comment on the Draft Management Plan.

As part of the Review Strategy, Management Plan 8 has been advertised in the Prince George Citizen to solicit public comment regarding performance associated with the current management plan (See Public Involvement Report # 1).

As part of the Recreation Features Inventory, Notification Letters were sent to all recreational user groups known to operate within the Prince George area. This process was necessary to collect comments from recreational users regarding new areas of interest or new activities occurring within TFL 30. These new features or activities were then added to the inventory files and thus integrated into the management plan process. The Recreation Features Inventory began in May of 1999 and was completed in September 1999. The results of this process are summarized in this report.

A total of 45 Notification Letters were sent to solicit input for both the MP 8 review and the Recreation Features Inventory process.

The review and comment period for the Draft Management Plan was held from February 23 to March 30, 2001 and was initiated with 6 advertisements in the Prince George Citizen from February 10, 2001 to February 23, 2001. The term of the above review and comment period was determined to be inadequate. In agreement with Staff at the Ministry of Forests Regional Office, Canfor initiated a second review and comment period which was held from May 3, 2001 to July 2, 2001. This review and comment period was initiated with an advertisement in the Prince George Citizen on May 3, 2001. The second review and comment period was conducted to meet

the full requirements of Section 2.13 of Canfor's Licence Agreement and in accordance with direction from the Regional Manager in a letter dated April 27, 2001.

3.0 AGENCY INVOLVEMENT

Agency Staff conducted a comprehensive review of the Draft Management Plan. This review resulted in a letter from the Regional Manger on April 27, 2001 outlining a number of changes to the Draft Management Plan that are required to meet contractual and legal requirements.
