Thank you for your January 3rd and February 6th E-mails in regards to MP # 8. Your comments and this letter will be included in the Final MP #8 submission to the Chief Forester.

We have discussed the two plans – the MP and the Forest Development Plan (FDP) - with you at various meetings but I can understand the confusion of the two. The FDP deals with specific harvest plans in the vicinity of your cabin. The FDP is referred on an annual basis and covers operations over a five-year period. I sent a referral letter to you (dated February 4th, 2000) along with a portion of the map that shows our plans as they directly relate to your property. The referral letter went to people who we have had correspondence with in regards to the TFL, and particularly to those people who attended the last meeting held at the Wilson Creek Dump in 1998 (30 letters). We also specifically referred the FDP to local native bands and advertised the plan in the local papers in both Salmon Arm and Sicamous. We encourage comments on the FDP to deal with the operational issues such as harvesting and road building. As your E-mails indicate, you have made some comments in regards to both plans – I will reply to your comments as they specifically relate to the MP.

The liability that Federated Co-operatives Limited (FCL) accepts is related directly to the Forest Practices Code Act of B.C. (Code), Forest Act, and other related Acts as well as the licence document and MP for the TFL. Under the Code, FCL is expected to carry out various assessments and ensure activities such as road building and harvesting are in compliance with those assessments and operational plans. The District Manager approves operational plans that are developed based on the assessments. The operational plans are also signed and sealed by a professional (a Registered Professional Forester or Engineer depending on the situation) when submitted to the DM for approval. The level and number of assessments required to be carried out as part of the operational plan will depend on the type of terrain, the

risk involved the location of the plan, etc.

Specific assessments are included in the Code under various regulations and have to be carried as part of the operational plan. The MP specifically states that FCL will comply with the Code. We are bound to follow the Code in any case and accept the liability associated with activities approved under the Code.

In regards to the FDP, we have changed our original plans for the area above your cabin. As the map indicates and as pointed out at the meeting in 1998, we no longer have a main access road running from the dump across Hasemann Creek. As I indicated at the meeting, we decided it would be in everyone's best interest to develop the road south of Hasemann Creek even though it meant an adverse road system. We have committed to gating the new road off at a bridge crossing some 8-km's from the first lots. The gate will be installed this year as road construction progresses down the hill. Access will only be permitted to FCL employees, contractors and the Ministry of Forests. We are trying to balance harvest plans with local concerns.

I hope I have appropriately responded to your comments in regards to MP # 8. If you require further clarification, please feel free to contact me at your convenience.

Parts of the document did not come through. From what I am able to read in the body of the document, I do not believe that the concerns that I previously raised in my email of October 7, 1998, are addressed in this document. Nor do I believe they will be addressed in the FDP, because timber removal with the methods which are proposed will cause negative impact. These concerns relate to slope stability, water quality, property value, aesthetics, recreation and tourism.

I believe that your MP must formally accept liability for any negative impacts, and ask that you reply to me to confirm that liability is accepted by FCL.

Further to your letter of January 14, 2000, in which you requested my approval under Section 64(5) of the *Forest Act* for relief from the annual cut control requirements under Section 64(2)(a) of the *Forest Act* for Tree Farm Licence No. 33.

Section 64(5) of the *Forest Act* states that, "If the allowable annual cut available to a tree farm licence holder is less than 50 000 m³, the regional manager, on application of the licence holder, may substitute a different requirement than that set out in Subsection 2(a)". Subsection 2(a) states that a holder of a tree farm licence must harvest a volume timber between 50 percent to 150 percent of the tree farm licence's allowable annual cut in a calendar year.

The allowable annual cut available to TFL No. 33 under the current management plan, is 22 500 m³. As the allowable annual cut of TFL 33 is less than 50 000 m³ and whereas by removing the annual cut control constraints of Section 64(2)(a) will provide your company with improved economic efficiencies for operations within TFL 33, I hereby grant your request by amending the cut control requirements for TFL 33.



Effective January 1, 2000, subsection 64(2)(a) will no longer apply to the volume of timber harvested in a calendar year. The periodic cut control requirements of Subsection 64(2)(b) of the *Forest Act* will continue to apply to the volume of timber harvested in a five-year cut control period.

Thank you for your letter of November 24, 1999, requesting revisions to the schedule to complete Management Plan (MP) No. 8 for Tree Farm Licence (TFL) 33. As you are aware, I have been delegated the authority to approve MP No. 8, and determine the allowable annual cut (AAC) for TFL 33.



Ministry staff confirmed that you have been trying to submit the final version of the 20-year plan and the timber supply analysis. I accept the reasons in your letter to use the most current data from the evolving Okanagan-Shuswap Land and Resource Management Plan, and in accordance with Paragraph 2.32 of the TFL 33 agreement, I hereby approve the revised target dates as detailed in the following table:
